The only theory which accounts for the continuance of the infestation in the face of so unimpeachable a public is that some persons—namely, those who are not in the least deterred by the sight of a single person in the street, or else think they must buy, shamelessly keeping the wares bestowed upon them, and furtively passing out the corresponding currency.

The *Advertiser* recommends heroic treatment for the ailment, suggesting that "a few prize candy packages thrown out of the window, a little sturdy resistance, a single dash of the fishy books and periodicals tumble upon the floor, and ostentatious tearing-up of circulars unread would wonder in relieving sufferers. The evil is increasing at such a rate, that unless something is done by those who are vexed by it, the heat and dust of a summer journey will be too late for the discomforts to be endured by travelers."

The counts in this indictment might be extended, but the above are sufficient to prove that the Democracy is not the reform party.
