### Peter McManus Leaves Lasting Legacy in Belgrade Lakes


Peter McManus, long time resident of Belgrade Lakes, passed away peacefully with family and many Great Pond Yacht Club friends by his side on May 24th, 2021.





All found, hidden and guarded None at last year's ferry spot, where charted Found, three more and noted



# Live Like You Love Your Lake

Lake-friendly living isn't just for those who live along the shorelines of the Belgrade Lakes. Of Lourse, lakefront properties are ground zero for "keeping the dirt" out of the lake, but water runs off the land and flows into lakes from the surrounding hillsides, stream corridors and lands all around us. Collectively, these nutrients can result in excess phosphorus - the primary culprit of excessive algae blooms which turn our lakes green. The bottom line is that the lands and lakes of the Belgrade Lakes watershed are very much connected.

This why the 7 Lakes Alliance operates science-based water quality initiatives AND is an accredited land trust. We are charged with safeguarding the land and water of the Belgrade Lakes watershed and we do this by:

- Implementing sound, science- based water quality initiatives on all the Belgrade Lakes
- Managing the LakeSmart and Youth Conservation Corps programs

• Strategically conserving and stewarding lands throughout the watershed with a high priority on water quality, as well as habitat, recreation and our local economy

• Leveraging funding of Section 319 of the Clean Water Act (administered by the Maine Department of Environmental Protection) to tackle large, complex erosion projects HOW YOU CAN MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Everyone in the Belgrade Lakes Watershed makes daily decisions that can affect our lakes – what you plant, whether or not you choose to fertilize and what products you use, whether and how driveways are paved, and how you manage your camp road. You may think one expansive lawn or one eroding camp road on a large lake won't make a difference. But over time, that cumulative impact adds up to a "death by a thousand cuts".

To be clear, lake-friendly living is about finding solutions that work for you AND protect the lakes. For lakefront properties, vegetation helps keep our lakes clean and serves as the LAST line of defense for water quality.

Protection includes leaving the "duff layer" (leaves and pine needles on the ground). This spongy floor serves to absorb and filter storm water runoff before it can go into the lake. The addition of mulch or gravel to cover bare soil is another good first step for homeowners who want to reduce potential runoff.

Planting a buffer along the shoreline is one of the most effective ways to help prevent erosion. Buffers are ideally built of native ground coverings such as low bush blueberry plants and are often what is on undeveloped shorelines. Picking blueberries for your morning pancakes is an added bonus!


Other key strategies include not using fertilizer, maintaining your septic system and not planting grass buffers at the shoreline. Mowed grass if a poor buffer even if you do not fertilize it as the shallow roots do not prevent runoff. If your lawn extends to the lake, consider adding a buffer between it and the lake. 7 Lakes Alliance can partner with you to come up with solutions that will help reduce the phosphorus that goes into the lake AND maintain your view. Ideally, landowners can become LakeSmart certified, but ALL steps toward becoming "Lake Friendly" can help protect the Belgrade Lakes now and for decades to come.





### **Fireworks: State Laws for Consumer Fireworks**

· Notwithstanding town ordinances, there are Maine state laws fireworks users must follow:

• Fireworks are permitted only between the hours of 9 am and 10 pm, except on the 4th of July and New Year's Eve and the weekends immediately before and after those holidays when the hours are from 9 am to 12:30 am.

Fireworks are permitted only on the user's own property or on the property of a person who has consented to the use of consumer fireworks on that property.

Also, please be considerate of the people, especially young children and people who get up early to work, and pets where fireworks are being used.

#### Work Zone Safety

• An average of 500 crashes occur each year in Maine work zones, resulting in several fatalities and 200 injuries. Workers in these areas are vulnerable to serious injury, as are vehicle occupants. To keep Work Zones safe:

- Slow down drive at the posted work zone speed
- Pay attention
- Merge as soon as safely possible when required
- Maintain a safe following distance
- Stay calm and be patient if there are traffic delays
- Remember to always wear your seat belt

### The Dams Keeper Report

Well, our ponds are really starting to feel the effects of another drought, although to date, we're in better shape than in the past five years at this point in the summer. Although the Great Pond and Long Pond dams have been completely shut down for a good two months now, Great Pond is actually still up above full pond, a whopping .36" but we'll take what we can get. Long Pond is now down .48" below full, the first time we've been below full pond since this past fall.

Our Dams Keeper on Salmon/McGrath reported in this morning that they are 2.4" below full pond with their one gate still opened just enough for the mandated 1cfs. Your Dams Committee is in the process of installing a new digital data logger at the Salmon Dam which will more accurately control that 1 cfs. which we suspect is closer to 2-3 cfs. Saving some more water for those Salmon/McGrath residents.

Our neighbors on Messalonskee are also starting to feel the "pain" as they are presently down 4.56" below full pond due to Essex Hydro's electricity demands but also this lack of precipita-

The water temperature on upper Long Pond is currently a whopping 74F - at the surface of course! You're on your own if you have to go further below; like standing up! Still refreshing and delightful!



# Maine International Film Festival July 9 Through 18

The Maine International Film Festival is L back! This year's festival will have screenings of eighteen new feature films, two remastered classic films, and four collections of short films. Screenings will take place from Friday, July 9 to Sunday, July 18, at the Waterville Opera House, at Railroad Square Cinema in Waterville, at the Skowhegan Drive-In, and online. The festival opens at 6:30 p.m. Friday, July 9, at the Opera House with the New England premiere of Nine Days, which the MIFF website calls "a deeply imaginative, heartfelt and contemplative story of unborn souls trying to make their way to

earth as one man in a remote location [God?] determines which among them is most suitable for the miraculous journey into life."

The festival will feature two collections of Maine shorts and three Maine feature films. One of the features, Fighting Indians, will be of special, local interest. This two-hour documentary explores the controversy over the mascot at Skowhegan Area High School, the last school in Maine to drop its Native American figurehead. Fighting Indians debuts Saturday, July 10 at 7:00 p.m. at the Waterville Opera House and will be shown again the following night at 8:30 at the Skowhegan Drive-In. The other two Maine features are both dramas, one shot in Maine and the other set here. The former, Bride in a

Box, is a quirky ghost story about young girl and her parents vacationing in a Maine coast house with a mysterious locked trunk at the end of a corridor. What is in that trunk, and is the girl somehow in communication with it? The latter film, The Catch, is a thriller about a woman, who returns to her estranged family in coastal Maine and hijacks a drug shipment thus putting all their lives in peril.
