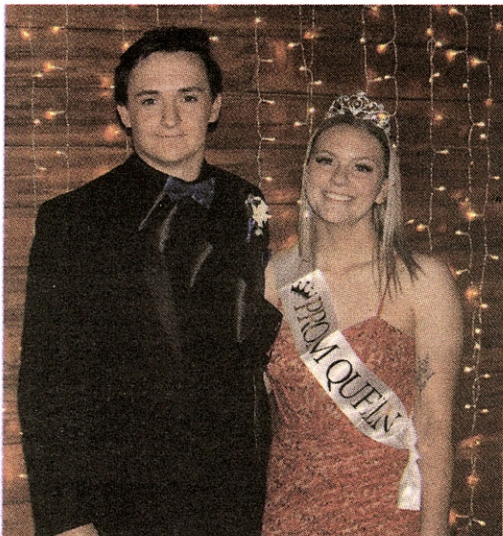


## "A Starry Night" Prom 2022

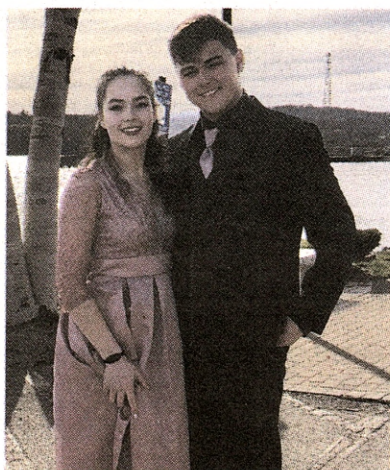

## Pay boosts

### Town manager offers range of raises

**BUCKSPORT** – Most town employees appear headed toward 5 percent raises, although a few will gain considerably more.

Unless the recommendations of Town Manager Susan M. Lessard are changed by the Town Council during their continuing budget review process, the new pay rates will take effect on July 1.

Lessard made her suggestions, in part, as a response to the higher cost of living. Since the first draft of the budget was completed, the cost of living recently has surged to more than 8 percent.

While the councilors are free to ask for adjustments in any of the many municipal accounts, they have ratified the current and three previous managers' recommended rates when it comes to setting employee compensation.

In a telephone interview this week, Lessard said that while she wanted all employees to get higher than recent pay hikes, other higher salary rates reflect her attempt to keep some pay rates competitive with those in similar size Maine communities. Other higher than 5 percent raises were recommended for positions which have become increasingly hard to fill, she said. She cited public safety services and assessing posts.

Finally, she said she wanted to recognize those responsible for outcomes and/or managing others were factors in her recommendations.

The town manager also said that the higher pay levels were part of the continuing effort to keep Bucksport's most-experienced personnel here and not lose their local knowledge.

The higher than 5 percent raises being recommended are in the upper ranks of the public safety, highway and assessing departments.

The payroll and fringe benefit costs account for roughly 75 percent of the approximately \$10 million municipal budget for the next fiscal year. Here are the manager's proposed pay rates for 2022-2023:

- Town manager – \$111,700, plus a return to a \$5,000-a-year allotment

for professional development expenses. Her contract is reviewed annually and now runs through 2024.

- Director of public safety – \$107,400, up 19.6 percent from this year's rate of \$90,000.
- Highway director – \$74,500, up from \$71,000 this year.

- Five others in the road crew each will receive – exclusive of overtime – from \$52,500 to \$56,500. A sixth is budgeted at a few dollars shy of \$50,000, and the seventh is listed at \$46,400. The pay levels reflect their many years on the crew.

- Deputy police chief – \$91,560 – a \$16,400 increase.

- Police sergeant – \$73,300.

- Two veteran police patrol officers will receive pay in the low \$60,000 range, and all but two others will top \$50,000 apiece. One of the remaining two will be over \$49,000 before any overtime earnings.

- Deputy fire chief – The budget for the fire department and EMTs was to be submitted in time for council review tonight (5/12). The firefighter/EMT union talks were nearly finished yesterday (5/11).

- Community and economic development director – \$65,200, up from \$62,000.

- Code enforcement officer – \$65,000, an 11.2 percent increase from the current \$58,500.

- Assessor – \$58,118. Her pay includes a 2 percent raise for her two years on the job here; the 5 percent cost of living increase and a 10 percent general increase based on her increased experience and the manager's effort to put the compensation more in line with that of other department heads.

- Town clerk – \$56,867.

- Town councilors – The councilors' pay rates – \$40 per meeting for six of them and \$50 a session for the mayor – are budgeted as unchanged.

The current rate has been in place for a number of years, and efforts by one or more councilors in the past to raise the pay have been thwarted by their colleagues. Mayor Peter Stewart has said, "Nobody should do this for the money."

## Prospect quarry plan nixed – again

**PROSPECT** – The company seeking to build a quarry and stone crusher at Bowden Point this week sustained another setback, with the firm's third application to state authorities to allow use of the site was rejected.

Specifically, an agency within the state Department of Environmental Protection ruled the applications submitted on April 15 was "deficient."

Jessica M. Damon, the licensing manager for the Bureau of Land Resources, said Salmons Inc. of Virginia Beach, VA, will have to submit new site plan location and natural resources protection applications.

Salmons, a concrete producer, wants to quarry the granite, crush it and send the stone to Virginia by barge. A huge stoncrusher and a dock would be built on shore to process the stone and be accepted for processing.

Both the site location application and the one seeking approval under the

Natural Resource Protection Act must be re-worked and re-submitted to the environmental department as a package before the \$12 million project can be further reviewed by the state authorities.

Damon reminded the company that its own delays triggered the need for a new public notification process because Salmon failed to file within 90 days of the rejection of the previous plan.

Opponents of the plan managed to gain a unanimous Town Meeting vote in favor of a six-month moratorium on such industrial projects to allow time to review the town's rules and the other implications of the project. More comprehensive reviews of those rules already are in progress, apparently spurred on by the Salmons Inc. proposal.

The quarry would be near a rural residential area and its dock and the related activity could have an impact on the river.

## Tradition resumes!

**BUCKSPORT** —

The municipal animal shelter off Central Street has achieved a very high rate of pet placement. Tonight (5/12), the town councilors will tour the place. While a number of improvements have been made in recent years, the councilors are trying to decide whether the buildings should be thoroughly renovated or replaced, and even if the shelter should be moved to some other site.

Replacing the shelter could require having to ask voters for approval because of the expense.



# Strictly for adults

One of many virtues of this region is the collective willingness, even enthusiasm, of residents to support all manner of good causes.

That is why we feel supporting a project to launch a van service for our oldest residents, one ready to serve five or even seven days a week if the need is there and the money can be raised. Such a service would be for all older people. Those who could would be encouraged to drop a little something in the cash box; for those it would be a financial stretch would ride free. Any person who abused the "pay system," we suspect there are ten or more others who would be more than generous, especially if a van ride improves their lives.

We're aware the town manager is awaiting recommendations from the consultant for the Bar Harbor-based agency that now provides taxi and van service here each Wednesday. However, that advice is unlikely to include a recommendation of daily service. Look about, and see the people trapped in their homes who want - nay, need) convenient transportation. They would go at least weekdays including medical appointments and grocery shopping. They also crave rides to places they'd like to go, including the Penobscot River Walkway, The Alamo or even sporting events in which their grandchildren are participating.

**EDITORIAL**

If there is one thing most older people don't want is to ask for help lest they impose on their families and friends. Many families live miles away from their loved ones.

Drivers? There must be a small corps of folks who would pass a police review of their driving credentials, and who could drive one or more four-hour shifts a week. Each could be paid a small stipend, in some cases supplementing Social Security or other retirement income. An older resident, skilled in all things automotive, could shepherd the van through the routine maintenance process; and other retirees could put their work skills to good use as schedulers or dispatchers. (There's a lot of talent going unused in this town because nobody asked.)

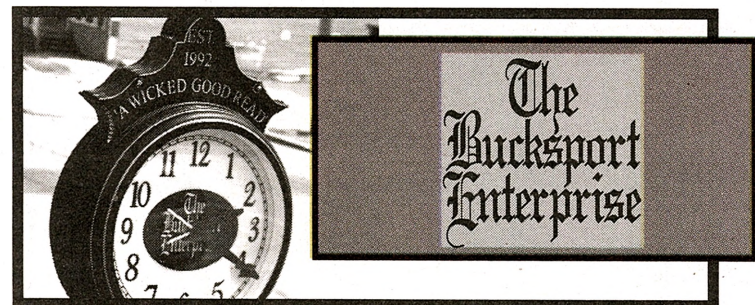
A few years ago, a campaign backed by this newspaper raised the money to make historic Wilson Hall safe enough to use -- plywood covering the windows was replaced with plastic and daylight cascaded in, chasing off decades in the darkness. A few town councilors toured the structure, some seeing it for the first time and others seeing it in a new light. Ultimately they not only sold the place for \$1; they provided a six-figure incentive to the buyer to repair the building. (Earlier, one councilor had pledged he wouldn't vote one dime to save the building, preferring to spend over \$50,000 to raze it.) Now, a private owner is methodically restoring Wilson Hall to its former showpiece status.

A van service here is most likely to succeed as a town-affiliated operation, which would allow tax deductions for donors, access to tax-free gasoline and fleet insurance rates, routine servicing at the town garage or the district's garage in Orland, scheduled auditing as part of the annual municipal audit and continuing oversight by the councilors to assure the service remains responsive to local concerns.

We would like to renew our request to the town manager that she ask the council to appoint a small study panel (three to five members, max.) That group would be given three months to make practical recommendations to the council which would decide the final go/no go decision. The goal is some action, not just more unfocused talk.

Under a private arrangement, the money would go through private hands and the project would become more cumbersome and probably unlikely.

In a town which just spent over a quarter of a million dollars on a streetsweeper, a van to serve many in our community is not an indulgence. Indeed, a van emblazoned "The Bucksporter" and "We value our elders!" circulating through the region would do more to communicate the special nature of our community than any catchy phrase or slogan.

### Esther Louise Bowden 1935 - 2022

Esther Louise Bowden passed away on April 30, 2022, following a recent decline in health, with family by her side. Over the past 20 years she had endured several cancer surgeries and treatments; always with a positive acceptance and the determination to enjoy life and remaining independent up until this past winter.

Esther was born on July 14, 1935, in Harrington, Maine, daughter of Teresa and George Ames. At age 6, they moved to Bucksport, Maine, where she resided for the remainder of her life.
