Community Events Make A Comeback


n Saturday, August 7, a large crowd (large for this area) will hang over the bridge between Belgrade Lakes and Rome, gather closely on Lakepoint Real Estate's shorefront on the stream and edge in by watercraft as one by one loon imitators stand on the dock and make various admirable loonly noises.

Their endeavors are very serious. For 4 decades the Belgrade Lakes Loon Calling Contest has brought oohs and aahs (but not loons) to the bridge area and this summer the tradition continues. Sign-up will be at 6:30 pm, calling, divided into 3 age groups, starts at 7 pm.

This year's contest will begin with a moment of silence for the late Horatio Castle of Castle Island Camps who founded the contest and for lifetime Belgrade summer resident and avid loon calling attendee, Stephanie Rothchild, who passed away from injuries sustained during Belgrade's recent microburst.

Other seasonal contests, festivals and gatherings that pivot around community traditions, from single to week-long events, are making a welcome comeback, too. Some, such as Old Hallowell Day, have already taken place. Others are on the summer agenda:

On a longer schedule, August 1 through 8, Skowhegan River Fest provides many family-friendly and Kennebec River-themed activities from standup paddle boarding, to Moonlight Madness, bed races, lobster and chicken barbecues, Family Fun Day, a glow stick river run, a whole lot of live music and fireworks.

Waterville's signature celebration, Taste of Waterville, on Wednesday, August 4, will be held at Head of Falls on the Kennebec River. The Taste will include a variety of food from food truck and restaurant menus, cultural demonstrations, ethnic entertainment, beer/wine gardens and live entertainment including Downeast Brass, Borderline Express and Stolen Mojo.

And, the celebration with the theme that says it best, Madison-Anson Days, takes place August 20-22 with a return of the popular boat tour along the Kennebec River, pig scramble, petting zoo, dunk tank, parade, dynamite cookoff, music and food.

And the theme? After the crazy year we had it's time to get out and celebrate: "Why we love living in Maine!"

Play On! Comedy August 19, 20, 21

The Vienna Woods Players are preparing their second presentation, a play by Rick Abbot, "PLAY ON!!", for August 19-21 at the Vienna Union Hall. This three-act performance is about a small community theater group preparing and staging a play; Act I, Practice; Act II Dress Rehearsal; and Act III, the Performance. As they enact an amateur playwright's attempt at an Edwardian England murder (more or less) mystery, all kinds of things go wrong and the worst nightmares of a play director and cast should prove hilarious for the Vienna audiences.

In the cast of Play On!, Rosemary Baker's character attempts to direct the play "Murder Most Foul", caught between the idiosyncrasies of its amateur playwright, played by Jan Collins, and its amateur cast in which: Jason Woofenden is the heroic and romantic lead who endeavors for the hand of ingenue actress, Allison Kuhns; Tim Davis and Joan Cook portray members of the wealthy nobility targeted with stealth by the allegedly murderous, (but charming) villain, Don Peterson; and (yet to be found actress) the house maid caught up in the drama of the Edwardian period, "What, on Saint Swithins Day"? While the playwright attempts to highlight the 'nuances' of the play, stage manager and prompter, Laura Church, struggles to just bring out the words and actions in each act; and sound, light, and set technician Janet Roderick tries chaotically to keep the set and sound effects



together. At the center of the plot is a gem with a curse that spells death, as enacted by the various players.

The V.W. Players are based at The Union Hall, Vienna's 133 year old cultural center (5 Vienna Road) and contribute to over a century's tradition of theater, music, dance in the Hall (also basketball, graduations, Grange meetings, etc.). The cast draws from Rome and Belgrade, as well as Vienna, and beyond to Mt Vernon, Fayette, Wilton, and Portland. After performing together for years with Cheryl Herr-Rains writing and/or directing, they organized in 2019 in order to provide some year-to-year continuity in planning,

and to enable her to share tasks with players and shift toward a producer role. She is joined by Karla Arceneaux, assistant director, June Cauldwell, who uses her 'Sewly For You' skills to collaborate in creating costumes and Greg Cauldwell, updating set construction.

Performances will be Thursday, Friday, and Saturday evenings at 7:00 with a Saturday matinee at 2:30. Current community COVID precautions will be respected. As seating is limited, reservations are recommended by emailing viennaplayers@gmail.com This is a play in which you don't want to encourage the cast to "break a leg", as it might happen, and they'll just have to Play On!

Drive Out To A Drive-In



New, small and nearby, the Narrow Gauge Drive-In in Farmington offers the perfect family movie night outing: a scenic drive, a small town setting, a good film and a unique experience. With roughly only 325 drive-in theaters left in the United States, out of 4,000 at their peak, and only 7 left in Maine, which peaked at 39, a drive-in outing is as much historic adventure as it is entertainment.

The name Narrow Gauge has historic connotations, too. Narrow gauge or two-footer trains (the tracks were two feet wide) networked throughout much of Franklin County, grandly transporting summer folks in luxury parlor cars from Farmington to the Rangeley Lakes resorts and hauling logs on flatbeds along the Carrabassett River route to the many mill towns, including Farmington.

Open since last summer, the drive-in is a popular attraction for the many families who want to maintain social distancing, stick to their family pod and have a get-out-of-the-house experience. With shows every evening except Tuesdays, the gates open at 8 pm, the movie begins at 8:30 pm. Tickets are \$15 per carload, \$10 on Mondays, a maximum of six persons per car, and may be purchased at the drive-in or online. Bring the confirmation to be scanned. A snack shack with restrooms is available.

Other entertainment options at the Narrow Gauge complex include an indoor cinema, the Big Sky Grill, monthly Craft Fairs, the Whistlestop Concert Series and camping in conjunction with the concerts. Future concerts include Maine Dead Project August 7 and Rustic Overtones August 14. Craft Fairs are scheduled for July 31, August 14 and September 11. 
Counting Loons



The third Saturday in July is the annual loon count in Maine, coordinated by Maine Audubon. See: (https://www.maineaudubon.org/projects/loons/ →annual-loon-count/). This year's count took place July 17th and was the 38th annual count in this important ongoing citizen-science project dedicated to better understanding one of Maine's most iconic birds. Every year over 1000 volunteers, of which I am one, attempt to count all the loons on over 300 Maine lakes at the same time. It's organized like a military operation, and I am the coordinator for the dozen or so volunteers on Long Pond, which is divided into 9 Survey Areas, with a 10th in Ingham Pond. Early in the morning all counters head for their assigned section of the lake to be in position to count all the adult loons and loon chicks in their area between 7:00 AM and 7:30 AM. I left my dock around 6 AM, planning to fish for a bit before picking up my counting partner, Fred Knight, at his dock on the way to our Survey Area. It was overcast but with practically no wind, almost perfect conditions for spotting loons.

Our assigned area was a cove that has been used for many years by a pair of loons that typically nests on a secluded beach on a small peninsula. For several years, this pair was unsuccessful in raising very many chicks because landbased and avian predators have found the nest and eaten the loon eggs before they hatched. Two years ago, the Belgrade Lakes Association (BLA), as part of their ongoing study of loons on Great and Long Pond (more information in Dick Greenan's loon articles), built and installed a floating raft nest with an avian guard (to prevent predation by eagles, ravens, and blue herons). The nest was moored about 20-feet offshore from the usual nesting site to provide the loons some protection from terrestrial predators such as racoons, minks, et al... When land-based predators have to cross water to reach the nest, the defensive advantage shifts strongly in the loons favor! For the second year in a row, the loons successfully used this nest and on the morning of the count, there were two brand new loon chicks in the cove. As of press time, I had not received results from all of my counters but it appears likely that both adult and chick numbers are up somewhat from last year (2020 Long Pond, including Ingham: 38 adults, 3 chicks). Already 5 chicks have been reported.

I also got a little hiking in and some foraging for raspberries and mushrooms, which are becoming more common after the recent rains. As the summer progresses and COVID pandemic restrictions continue to ease, more and more visitors are returning to our area. A young family from CT recently decid-

his is the season for loon chicks throughout the Northeast and, as we stated last week, it's been a good and productive summer here in the Belgrades, at least loon-wise! The weather has been another story! We are now monitoring eleven chicks between both Great and Long Ponds which


is great compared to last year's total of just four that fledged. In other words, only four made it to twelve weeks of age or so and were able to adequately feed themselves and fly off with the fall's migration.

With eleven chicks this year, we're really able to observe some interesting feedings and sometimes, attempted feedings with adult crayfish that are just too large to swallow or a sunfish that's twice the size of the chick's head! These can be trying times for everybody.



Conservation Too -

More on **Invasive Plants**

n invasive plant is defined as a plant that 1] is Anot native to a particular ecosystem/area, 2] causes economic or environmental harm or may cause harm to human health and 3] which can establish and spread in natural areas.

They are called "invasive" for a reason. While only a small fraction of our "non native" plants are considered "invasive" once you can recognize a few of them, "invasives" seem to be everywhere. This week I'll discuss a few of those that seem more prevalent or seem to be on the increase. Those we readily identify are Japanese Knotweed [some people refer to it as bamboo]; Multiflora Rose [those large clumps of white flowers often seen in abandoned fields. See photo.]; Honeysuckle [often taking over at the woods edge]; Autumn Olive [a very fragrant shrub often found along roads edges]. Another we have recently seen spread is Japanese Barberry [a thorn covered shrub with groups of leaves along the twig] and Asiatic Bittersweet vine with its tree choking habit and you begin to get the picture. Most of these I've mentioned are already established in parts of Kennebec County. Management can best be done by knowing what they look like and limiting their spread. That is an ongoing effort since we are unlikely to completely eradicate them.

However, there are other "invasives" that we lished. still have a chance to control and limit their spread. ous health hazard] and the Pale Swallowwort vine handouts. are examples of these. 





7 Lakes Courtesy Boat Inspector **Thwarts Milfoil from Entering Long Pond**

routine shift at the Long Pond boat Launch took an unexpected turn recently for 7 Lakes Alliance Courtesy Boat Inspector Jarvin DeHaven, a lecturer of English at Perdue University.

Upon inspecting a boat about to enter Long Pond, DeHaven quickly identified two, one-foot long sections of a suspicious plant that he thought likely to be invasive milfoil. According to 7 Lakes CBI Coordinator, Cody Pajic, "DeHaven followed milfoil inspection protocol to a T. His trained eye identified the plant as suspicious but invasive milfoils are almost impossible to distinguish from native milfoils without DNA analysis. Dr. Bernacki, professor of biology and invasive species ecology at Saint Joseph's College of Maine, ultimately confirmed what we suspected – the large plants were indeed invasive variable milfoil. "

Sharon Mann, who heads 7 Lakes Alliance's invasive aquatics program, noted that one "very small fragment can root quickly and eventually lead to serious problems, so preventing two very large intact sections from going into Long Pond was a great save." Mann has overseen milfoil remediation efforts since 2018. This includes removing boatloads of milfoil from May to October by hand and diver assisted suction harvesting. She also oversees the very labor-intensive effort to put down burlap barriers over the milfoil plants in an ongoing battle to fight of spread of a "very aggressive invasive plant that survives in a wide range of climate conditions, including under ice." Mann noted that the thought of this aggressive plant spreading into another one of our Belgrade Lakes keeps her up at night. On a positive note, she pointed out that "our relentless efforts have contained the existing infestation and kept it from spreading further into Great Pond."

The success of our invasive aquatics program to date is only possible with the support of the Maine Department of Environmental Protection, the towns of Rome and Belgrade, Belgrade Lakes Association and 7 Lakes Alliance supporters.

7 Lakes leads workshops on Invasive aquatic plants identification for citizens to adopt their shoreline and coordinates invasive plant paddles for volunteers in collaboration with our lake association partners. The ponds are all full now. You can turn off the spigots! So much for the drought – at least here in the Belgrades.

Long Pond is presently 3" ABOVE full pond which means that the water going over the 100' spillway/walkway at the Wings Mill Dam is 3" deep. Great Pond is 3.72" also above full. Messalonskee is 3.6" below full pond with their electricity generation and Salmon/McGrath is now 1" above full pond. With 2.28" of rain in just the past ten days, it looks as if the water table is beginning to stabilize and the ponds are responding accordingly by filling back up.

As I write this week's column, they are now forecasting just .34" of precipitation for the next ten days which may imply that this cold, soggy weather pattern has finally blown itself out and we can get back to the Chamber of Commerce weather for which the Belgrades are known. I sure hope so. I wish I had invested in umbrellas instead of Dams!



Finding Freedom by Erin French

Summertime in the Belgrades

"The ability to touch a complete stranger with a plate of food, to feed them and awaken their senses while filling them up with joy--it's an intimacy that you can't help craving. It's an intimacy that can only be made with food--a reason why restaurants can be so enchantingly addictive."

The Lost Kitchen is a thriving small restaurant, seating 40 guests only, in nearby Freedom, Maine in the middle of nowhere yet known around the world. Talk to anyone who has had a meal cooked by Erin French, author of this autobiography, and you will be envious of her dinner delights.

At first I thought this book was all about food and recipes, but I kept reading.

Reservations for meals became so very problematic because of the volume of telephone calls that Erin French tried an original idea, just like every recipe she has developed through a lifetime of loving cooking for family and friends. "Postmarking a postcard on April 1 and sending it off to Freedom," was the simple idea where the lottery-style drawing of post card winners for a phone call scheduling of dinner seating. "It felt personal and honest...no redial, no exhaustion, no rushing." It also revived the little post office in Freedom.

I am surprised how open and personal the author is about her problems she experienced beginning as early as age five. Eating that warm crunchy donut at her dad's restaurant revealed a world where her father seemed happy and her grandpa whistled in the kitchen. Prior to that her dad was not happy at home, during those all important formative years.

The daily struggles of her mom to dance around her dad's drinking and the differences with her sister are portrayed in great detail. Her story is so very extraordinary, that sometimes I read almost too much about the intricate difficulties. I Neve Promised You a Rose Garden is the dark classic which came to mind.

With every turn there were problems except when she began to experience the joy in her dad's small, greasy spoon restaurant. Erin French learned quickly but had scars on her arms from kitchen burns. She helped in the long hours of early morning prep for breakfast until late at night cleaning and driving the drunks home, including her dad. One drunk was over thirty miles of driving after her long hours of labor.

Her dad took advantage of her. She escaped his rule by attending college in

Boston even though she had earned a complete scholarship at the Orono campus of the University of Maine. I loved that her mother supported this decision by tearing up the Orono offer and not telling her husband. "He was brutally honest that the cost of tuition for a year at Northeastern was as much as a brand new Harley-Davidson..." and Erin would drive the Harley drunks home week after week from her dad's restaurant.

A pregnancy without the town boyfriend marrying her drove Erin's dad nuts. Dropping out of college after two years. The family loving her son Jaime, such a beautiful name for her son, I love you in French. Marrying later, with her husband adopting Jaime and running a restaurant in Belfast with full capacity seating. Living over the restaurant gave Erin the stairway she wanted to give her son Jaime attentions anytime in spite of tension with her husband.


A heart wrenching divorce with two days of incarceration due to medications prescribed by a doctor for years of anxiety. Erin's aunt taking her to the airport for rehab somewhere. Separation from her son Jaime and the pain of her husband keeping her son from her, even preventing phone calls.

Amidst all the trauma, I was struck by her one phone call allowed did not go to her mother at one point of her treatment for doctor prescribed drugs. Instead of calling the one person who probably saved her life, she called the Belfast restaurant to make sure the staff was running her successful business smoothly without her. She had trained them well and cooked ahead for her weeks of rehab.

I will not spill the beans about the rest of the story of desperately missing her son. Throughout she constantly refers to foods and the warmth provided. Even that delicious meatloaf the family enjoyed at home despite the drunkenness of her dad. He lovingly shares his secret meatloaf concoction, so look for his recipe revealed in Finding Freedom. Yes, lots of cooking ideas in these chapters, even from her dad's business.

Many freshly picked herbs and flowers from the field provide beauty and taste at her table. Making homes for her husband and Jaime, creating restaurant warmth and beauty are delved into with lots of labor, love and creativity. I wonder if the cover and back photo of a flowery table are a bit over the top? What do you think? *Continued on page 15....*

A Wake Up Call

That do you notice after you drink coffee? Are you more alert? V Awake? Able to process information? Is it possible that those living with memory impairment might benefit from a morning serving of caffeine? A study by Johns Hopkins University was able to provide information that caffeine may boost memory consolidation, the ability to strengthen memory and make memories more permanent. In the study participants were shown various photos and given caffeine after; they then came back the next day and were tested. Participants that were given caffeine after being shown the images were better able to identify the images from the previous day. This process implies not only does caffeine provide more alertness but may also play a role in memory.

As with most things: moderation is important. Too much caffeine for someone living with memory impairment may exacerbate some symptoms like paranoia and anxiety, so be cautious of how much caffeine is being consumed and when it is being consumed. Try going for a nice early morning walk that finishes with a cinnamon iced coffee! Check out a recipe from the Northbridge Eat Fresh, Eat Local kitchen:

- 1 oz Cinnamon Bun Syrup
- 4oz Strong double brewed coffee chilled
- 3oz half and half cream

I saw a television segment this summer on PBS showing the small cottages her husband built for pandemic servings offering social distancing last year. What a great innovation as Erin French also added more local products to her business, yet keeping it small.

I googled the distance from Belgrade to Freedom, about 35 miles and gas may cost \$35. The meal is expensive, with wine from her mother's advice in the cellar added, so be prepared for a feast that apparently is worth every ten dollars. Walking from the parking lot to the renovated old mill is charming with the rushing waters nearby as music for your sit down meal of only 40 special dinner guests. Women rule this business with the exception of one husband who is the dependable dish washer. Bless his heart!

Erin French even thanks her estranged dad at the end of this memoir."You may never read this, but without you I'm not sure who I would be. Thank you for introducing me to the kitchen. I found my life's passion standing at the stove, and it's all because of you."

The dedication means a lot to me. "For the women of the Lost Kitchen...my lost sisters. Your grace, grit, and everlasting love keep lifting me up."

They are a happy bunch and waltz around you as you eat, serving gracefully. No rushing the meal since the guests have all evening together, course after unique course and toasts to each other's pure enjoyment.

How far she has come from "I would inch forward to live because I had one small, sweet, kind, and gentle ten-year-old reason to, and that one reason alone was more than enough." Bravo Erin French for sharing her life decisions and battle with doctor prescribed drugs. Maybe one reader will find solace in her story.

Give this book as a gift to the special cook in your life. Share this memoir with a troubled friend. Read it for your own enlightenment about how incarcerated people are treated and how rehab can make a difference.

Erin French does not claim to be a chef because she never went to school to learn gourmet cooking. Instead she learned from an early age in her dad's restaurant, working in the grill line to put out plate after plate to a hungry bunch in Freedom. Now she serves different dishes, developed over her lifetime, back home once again in Freedom, Maine.
