Thanks for the maintenance and monitoring of lake protection, boat inspections, milfoil removal, invasive plant paddles and numerous conservation education and appreciation activities.





or might be highly restricted when the next year's season rolls around.


Thanks to the children who are raised in this strange seasonal work cycle and seem to understand.

#### 50th Annual Blueberry Festival Coming to Winslow Saturday, August 14!



One of Maine's all-time most popular, beloved, and downright yummy summer events—Winslow's annual Blueberry Festival—is coming this year on Saturday, August 14, from 7 a.m. to 1 p.m., to Winslow Congregational Church, 12 Lithgow Street, Winslow. Admission to the festival grounds is FREE.

Nearly 700 mouth-watering blueberry pies and "all things blueberry" baked goods will be available for sale. Blueberry pies (\$12 each; \$20 for 2; \$10 each for additional pies) may be picked up at the church anytime from 3 to 6 p.m. the previous evening (Friday, August 13) or the day of the festival (Saturday the 14th) from 7 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Kicking off the 50th Annual Blueberry Festival on Saturday will be a delicious Blueberry Pancake Breakfast, from 7 to 10 a.m. Cost of the breakfast will be \$7 per person and \$5 for children ages 12 and under. Tickets for the pancake breakfast will be available in advance at Winslow Congregational Church on the Saturday prior to the festival (August 7) from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m. In addition to the "all things blueberry" pies and other culinary delights, festival patrons will enjoy a Lobster Shore-Dinner Raffle; live classical, pop, folk, and blues music; local crafts vendors; a yard sale; a popcorn vendor; an agricultural exhibit featuring goats; a dunk tank sponsored by Winslow Community Cupboard food pantry; and a firetruck and police car.

#### Night-Before (Friday Evening) Chicken Bar-B-Q Supper

The night before the Blueberry Festival, there will be a Friday-evening (August 13) Chicken Bar-B-Q Supper (with "all the fixin's") at Winslow Congregational Church, which will be served by first-responders from the Clinton Fire Department. The Chicken Bar-B-Q Supper will run from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. Blueberry pies, blueberry baked goods, and a yard sale also will be available during the Friday-evening supper. Cost of the Chicken Bar-B-Q supper is \$12 per person, with advance tickets strongly encouraged, but day-of tickets also available. Advance tickets will be available at Winslow Congregational Church on the Saturdays prior to the festival (August 7) from 8 a.m. to 11 a.m., and also at Rita's House of Pizza (51 Bay Street) and Pool Tech (28 Charland St .) during regular business hours through Thursday, August 12.

#### More about the 50th Annual Blueberry Festival

A beloved community favorite since 1972, the Blueberry Festival raises funds to empower the local humanitarian/Christian-service work of Winslow Congregational Church. Celebrating its 193rd birthday this year, the historic church is housed in a building dating from 1796, which has been home to a worshipping congregation since 1828.

### Take It Outside -

he summer is flying by. Hard to believe this is the penultimate edition of "Summertime!" The weather has continued to be variable- some rainy days with cool nights interspersed with a few hot and humid days, but occasionally really nice for hiking in the shady woods. With more of our population vaccinated against COVID, many of last year's restrictions have been relaxed and we are seeing more of our traditional summer visitors. At the same time, we seem to have more visitors from throughout the State of Maine; many exploring our area instead of traveling out of state as they may have in the past. There continues to be an increase in family gatherings with an emphasis on outdoor activities. It is heartening to run into so many families out enjoying the local trails. While people have changed their schedules, Mother Nature continues to move forward with hers and this summer is moving forward just as rapidly as it always does.

Recently, my neighbors, Joel and Kathi King, returned from North Carolina with their 8-year-old grandson, Miles, for a week-long visit. Miles is an avid fisherman and Grandma Kathi asked me if I could take him out on Long Pond for a bit. The next morning, Kathi and Miles met me at the dock a bit before 7 AM and we headed down the lake toward a spot where the bass had been pretty actively feeding all week. The first thing I noticed was that the cool night (mid 50s F) had cooled the surface water from about 75F down to 70F overnight. I spotted loons feeding in an area and we slowed to trolling speed. I set up two trolling rods and began trolling with our lures about 25-feet down, right around the base of the thermocline. Before too long, we had a nice strike on the rod next to Miles. I grabbed the

up a nice battle but Miles was equal to the task, with just a bit of help from Grandma, Kathi. As I got ready to net the fish, it jumped near the boat and I realized he was battling a nice Rainbow trout. We soon landed a nice, fat 19-inch 'bow, which Ι carefully unhooked and took its picture in the net before releasing it. We continued trolling and

caught several smallmouth bass and a nice Yellow perch. I also ended up catching a nice 19-inch Rainbow trout that we decided to keep. When I cleaned and fileted the trout, I gave one filet to the Kings and kept one for dinner.

The increased precipitation has made this a banner year for mushroom foragers and Black Trumpet mushrooms are in all the usual spots and then some! Black Trumpets are some of my

Relaxing times, particularly during this breeding period, can be short lived as they all are constantly being challenged by their own kind, mostly territorial disputes.








### Conservation Too -

This seems to have been the season of invasives. Previously I had an article about invasive plants and the ways to monitor your property and manage for their spread. This week I will focus on invasive forest pests or "bugs". Maine's Soil & Water Conservation Districts have been working with the Department of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry, Division of Animal and Plant Health to help people identify invasive forest pests i.e. bugs that could do serious damage to our woodlands or in some cases cause you illness. While some of them have not yet appeared in Maine, many have. We need to be vigilant and identify them should they appear.

The browntail moth is already here and got the most press coverage this spring. Some areas of the State are affected more than others. Many people are experiencing the rash on their skin and other

problems. Kennebec County and the midcoast areas were more heavily infested. Some people and their trees have



suffered serious damage. As I write this the BTMoths are at the stage of laying their eggs in small webs in the leaves of trees. We expect those to hatch and become the caterpillars again in August. This moths' caterpillar has two distinct red/orange dots on its back. These caterpillars will then create distinctive tents later in the summer and early fall. Those winter webs appear at the end of branches rather than closer to the trunk in crotches of the branches. Oak trees and fruit trees seem the more likely targets.

The browntail moth caterpillar has tiny (0.15 mm) poisonous hairs (setae) that cause dermatitis (skin rash) similar to poison ivy on sensitive individuals. Direct contact with the caterpillar or indirect contact with airborne hairs may cause the reaction. Most people affected by the hairs develop a localized rash lasting a few hours or several days but on some individuals the rash can be severe and last for weeks. It is also possible for respiratory problems to develop which require a physician visit and possible treatment. We have yet to see how bad

### The Issue of Forest Pests i.e. "Forest Bugs"

> Another forest pest already here is Hemlock Woolly Adelgid. It is not that uncommon. We have been working to identify its location, possible spread and efforts to control damage. Evidence of its existence are "woolly' collections on the underside of hemlock branches along the stems where the needles occur. It only occurs on hemlock trees.

> Up until two years ago we had not officially seen the Emerald Ash Borer. It is now officially identified in Maine, particularly at our SW border with New Hampshire and also in Northern Maine. Identify it early and try and limit its spread. The Emerald Ash Borer can devastate woodlots of Ash trees. Once fully established, destroying the wood is often the best option. The small shiny green insects bore into the Ash trees and destroy the tree from the inside. Sick Ash trees are suspect. The insects are tiny [see photo of examples placed on a penny] and the actual holes in the tree's bark are also very small. The damage to the Ash tree is the best way to begin identification.

What can a person do? Try and learn how to identify some of these nasty Forest Pests. The

Maine Dept. of Agriculture, Conservation and Forestry has an excellent website for all invasives including these Forest Pests.



www.informe.org/portal/about\_me/invasives.ht ml If you think you have identified one of these critters, do not be afraid to call the Maine DACF. 207-287-3891. Or contact them through Maine Bug Watch at bugwathcme.agr@maine.gov. They would rather help you learn it is NOT an invasive than have you fail to report the real deal. Take a picture or collect the bug in a bag or bottle and keep it in the freezer. Help out in this effort to protect Maine from these invasives.



### The Dams Keeper Report

We were so spoiled by the drought inspired past five years of beautiful weather that it was so easy to take it for granted, although to the demise of our farmers and gardeners! This has been such an unusually cold and wet summer so far. Don't you think that we deserve a little bit better after putting up with the winters that we do? I do!

We just finished releasing some of the water both at the Village and at Long Pond's Wings Mill dam in order to get the levels back down to something reasonable, about three inches above full pond.

Long Pond is presently 2.5" above full pond with Great Pond at 2.64", also above full, with all of the gates completely shut back down. Snow Pond is today right at 3.84"" below full pond with their electricity generation and Salmon/McGrath is now 2" above full pond with their single gate still opened the mandatory 1 cfs. We received 1.76" of rain in just the past ten days, which honestly felt like so much more. We're still having showers practically every day and they are forecasting just .45" of precipitation

Tared fished from the children's bookshelves at Belgrade Library one Saturday a very special book of books featuring five iconic stories for kids' Read Alouds. The special feature in this particular compilation that impresses me is that each author wrote so many other great stories for your children's enjoyment.

A great guide for parents and a great read for the young from this one book of five literary achievements.

Camping Day by Patricia Lakin, Dino Pets by Lynn Plourde, Little Beaver and The Echo by Amy Mac Donald, Blueberries for Sal by Robert McCloskey, and Miss Rumphius by Barbara Cooney Porter are the FIVE!!!!!

Even though McCloskey and Barbara Cooney Porter are my favorites, your young reader will have you reread the ones they prefer. Reading and rereading the same good tale is what makes readers.

The author biographies are fascinating to me, because by now I thought I knew everything about Robert McCloskey and Barbara Cooney Porter. Not so.

Robert had a barn full of his paintings and illustrations out on the coast at Blue Hill which I shared with my elementary students in Maryland back in the day of teaching in public school. The film with the artist commentary kept my students riveted and then reading his many books followed.

According to this special book that Jared found for me, McCloskey did not start his art work until high school. Prior to that he was an avid musician playing piano, oboe, drums and harmonica. Homer Price stories and his harmonica come to mind immediately.

Machinery and taking things apart and reassembling was another early interest. Burt Dow and motor problems in his boat come to mind. One Christmas, young Robert invented a machine that turned their family Christmas tree. Wouldn't you like that for your tree?

Many of his stories take place on the coast because McCloskey moved from Ohio to Deer Isle, Maine. His two daughters, Sarah and Jane, are featured in his books. Sal is for Sally, as in Blueberries for Sal. these entertaining children's tales. Her favorite time as a kid was when she was sick and could stay at home from school to paint and draw all day. She used her mother's brushes and cleaned them when finished.

Barbara was raised in the New York City area like EBWhite and she longed for Maine like he did as a six year old. Every summer Barbara would spend time in Maine with her grandmother. EBWhite spent every summer from age six onward canoeing on Great Pond with his family and later with his son Joe. Childhood memories for both produced many works for children. Charlotte's Web is my favorite by White.

I found Cooney's biography of Eleanor Roosevelt at Lithgow Library in Augusta. What a joy to see that beautiful library addition with its grand enlargement, tripling its size. I sat and revelled in the children's large, sunny room, no longer in the basement that used to flood. Eleanor Roosevelt actually was thrown from the sinking Britannic and always feared heights and swimming.

Barbara eventually lived on the coast at Damariscotta after traveling to many foreign countries. Lupines left by Miss Rumphius are pictured beautifully in her paintings and story of planting seeds. We enjoy lupines here in Belgrade, not far from the coast.

Read some of the hundreds of good books for kids, many recommended and pictured in this one beautiful book that is in our Belgrade Public Library. It is part of "A Raising Readers Collection." Reading children's books is fun for all of us. Try a few. - Carto


