## Motel being sold?

# Spring Fountain is on the block

BUCKSPORT – There reportedly is a potential buyer for the padlocked Spring Fountain motel, but nobody at the Town Office apparently knows who is negotiating with who to move the deal along.

A Bangor-based affiliate of a realty office chain is said to be trying to put the proposed deal together.

Town officials are not certain what the prospective owner plans to do with the property, or even if it will remain a motel.

The only thing that's publicly clear is that anyone buying the roughly 40-unit motel on U.S. Route 1 will be getting an officially declared "dangerous building" that either must be brought up to code or demolished before the structure or the site can be used. The motel sits on a highly visible and relatively flat piece of property comprised of several acres.

The town also will be seeking to recover its costs, including the legal expense of finding the

building to be full of health and building code violations. The town also was involved in aiding some of the many displaced residents, some of whom had lived at the motel for extended periods.

The town also has legal fees from fighting an appeal from the New Jersey owner of the business. Getting any of that money back may be more difficult because the appeal has not made its way through the local court system because of delays attributed by court officials to covid-related problems.

The motel was purchased a few years ago with financing from the Machias Savings Bank after the current owner got Small Business Administration (SBA) backing. The current owner has bought and sold several lodging properties in the New York City/northern New Jersey area. The current taxes have been paid on the Spring Fountain, the town manager has said.

## Councilors ask to slow raises for key officials 4% is in the offing

BUCKSPORT – Some town councilors have launched a last-minute request to slow the pace of the planned raises for many of the town's key officials. While they don't want to reduce the raises they want them to occur over a two-year period beginning July 1.

The councilors asked Town Manager Susan M. Lessard to refigure the largest raises she has proposed for the top administrators. Lessard had said the raises were needed to keep Bucksport competitive with other communities. She was especially concerned about retaining the top police administrators, but said she found wide disparities in the pay rates for other posts when looking at the compensation scales of other Maine municipalities.

While most of the town employees are getting 5 percent cost-of-living raises, one department head was initially listed for a 2 percent increase after two years on the job, plus the 5 percent cost-of-living boost, plus another 10 percent to bring the compensation closer to that paid in other communities.

Lessard said she's committed to treating her staff fairly, and plans to again forego her scheduled \$5,000 annual reimbursement of her professional development expenses, as called for in

her contract. She also will accept a smaller wage increase than the one originally put in the budget. Both decisions are aimed at freeing up cash to help underwrite raises for the other administrators. Lessard had been in line to receive an annual salary of \$111,700, beginning July 1.

Spreading the raises over two years will not have a significant impact on the 2022-2023 budget. The manager is continuing to urge the council to raise taxes slightly when they gather early next month to set the mil rate. She's suggesting an increase that will translate to \$70-a-year more on a property assessed for \$100,000.

Bucksport has held or lowered its tax rate annually since 2015 when the rate was 17.10 on \$1,000 worth of assessed property.

Councilor Dan Ormsby appeared to lead the effort to re-examine the proposed raises for the administrators. He and others cited a recent flurry of concerns raised by their constituents. The review comes as the budget review process is close to coming to a close. A public hearing in the proposed budget will be held on June 2.

The councilors have had the pay numbers in advance, but made no public comment on them until last Thursday.

## IN THE WORKS . . . Tidbits from week's news

**MAKING A SPLASH** – The Tim Emery municipal pool will open on Monday, June 20. The staff's been hired, the pool has been checked. Now, it's time to add the children – and anyone else who wants to get in the swim of things.

**BROWNTAIL MOTHS** – Bucksport has hired an arborist to treat trees along the waterfront walkway and Main Street that have been identified as having browntail moths. This injection process is supposed to last for two years. One tree had to be removed because it was so severely attacked by the insects.

**BEAUTIFUL BUCKSPORT** – The Make Bucksport Beautiful Day on Saturday,

May 14 yielded many bags of litter and debris, as well as some furniture and "some other things", all of which were hauled away by the Public Works department.

**LET SUNSHINE IN?** – The would-be developers of a solar panel farm near the intersection of U.S. Route 1 and State Route 46 wanted the Town Council to give them a sense of whether the council would balk at their proposal if it passes muster in a Planning Board review.

At first, Mayor Peter Stewart said he was offended that anyone would seek a council determination before going to the Planning Board. Later, when pressed, Stewart said he has problems with any com-

mercial or industrial project that does not have clear benefits to local residents. Other councilors then took similar positions. Stewart led the opposition to a solar farm off River Road when it was proposed in a residential neighborhood. That resulted in the solar farm being relocated to a nearby industrially zoned land.

Last Thursday, Stewart's comments eventually seemed echoed by several councilors. A representative of the Lowell, MA-based solar firm was watching the proceedings as they were live-streamed on the internet. He may have gotten his query answered, but not the answer he was seeking. His firm negotiates the permits to build solar farms but sells them to others to operate.

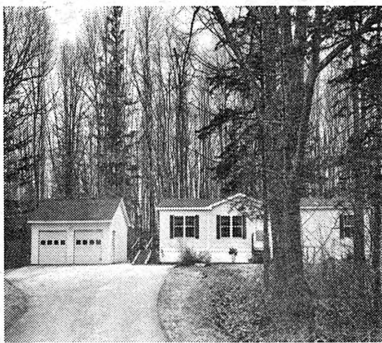

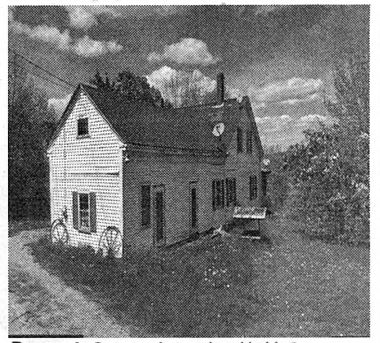

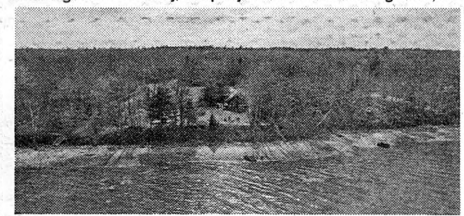

Those numbers now will go to validation referendum votes in each town on Tuesday, June 7.

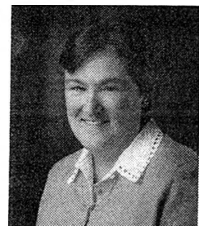

## Moving the earth

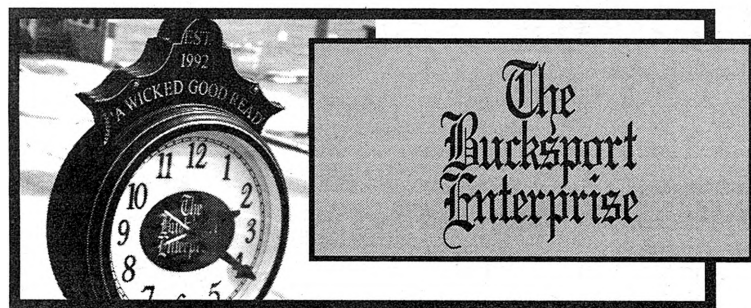

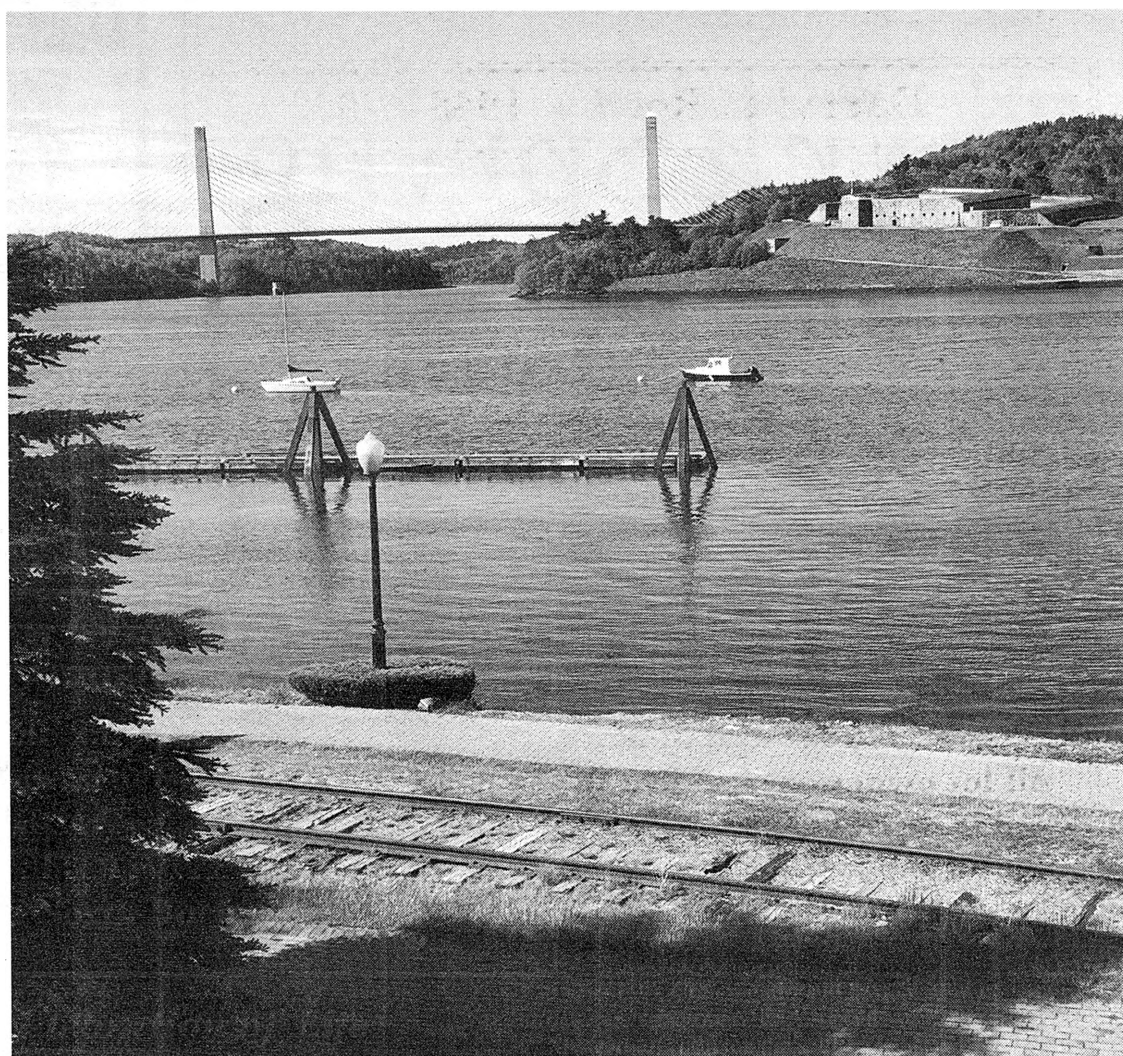

## Norfolk VA becomes Maine

Senator Susan Collins of Maine defends “common sense and home state pride”

Senator Collins, Ranking Member of the Transportation Appropriations Subcommittee, successfully reversed a USDOT proposal to designate the Maine ship's home port as Norfolk, Virginia

A misguided proposal would have changed the home port on the replacement vessel to Norfolk, Virginia. —

Washington, D.C.—U.S. Senator Susan Collins announced today that, following her advocacy, Maine Maritime Academy's new training vessel, the State of Maine, will proudly bear the designation of Castine, Maine, as its home port. The U.S. Maritime Administration (MARAD) had initially proposed labeling all new training vessels for state maritime academies as hailing from Norfolk, Virginia. As the Ranking Member of the Transportation Appropriations Subcommittee, Senator Collins strongly pushed back against this policy and was successful in convincing the agency to reverse course.

“The State of Maine training vessel is a great source of pride for Maine Maritime Academy and for the students and instructors who serve as the ship's crew,” said Senator Collins. “MMA's training vessels have always borne the home port of Castine, Maine, on their sterns, carrying Maine's rich maritime heritage to ports around the world.

MARAD's initial plan to designate the State of Maine's home port in Virginia not only defied logic, but it was also a disservice to MMA's exceptional instruction of generations of sailors in our state. MARAD's decision to change tack and adhere to its historical precedent is a victory for common sense and home state pride.”

“Maine Maritime Academy extends its sincerest gratitude to Senator Collins for her leadership on this matter which has ensured the continuation of the pride that we have had for 80 years here in Castine as our home port,” said Jerry Paul, President of Maine Maritime Academy.

In 2019, Senator Collins secured \$300 million for the construction and acquisition of a new training vessel for Maine Maritime Academy to replace the college's existing training ship that is nearing the end of its serviceable life. This ship is used to provide rigorous instruction and crucial maritime training, and it is indispensable for preparing students to excel in the Navy, the Coast Guard, and the maritime industry.

The stern of MMA's current training vessel designates its home port as “Castine, Maine.” Earlier this year, however, Maine Maritime Academy informed Senator Collins that MARAD was planning to designate the home port for the new State of

Maine as Norfolk, Virginia.

This labeling change had already impacted the new training ship for the State University of New York Maritime College.

At an Appropriations hearing in April, Senator Collins raised this issue to Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg. In response, Secretary Buttigieg pledged to Senator Collins that he would, “continue to be in touch with your office and to work with you on this because I know it's of great interest to the state academies and [I] understand the importance of the issue.”

Senator Collins also spearheaded a letter to Secretary Buttigieg that was signed by her colleagues from Texas, California, New York, and Massachusetts, which host state maritime academies that would also have been affected by this home port designation issue. Their letter directed MARAD to ensure that the training vessels funded by Congress display the home port as is currently shown on each state maritime academy's training vessel.

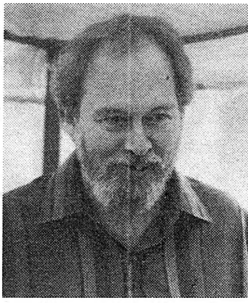
As a result of this coordinated effort led by Senator Collins, MARAD is revising the hailing ports on the training vessels to reflect the locations of the respective colleges.

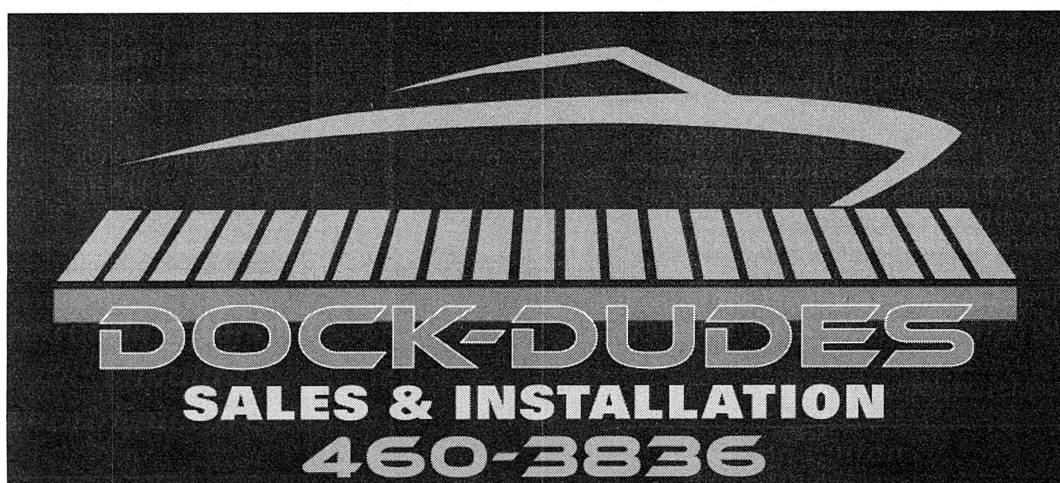

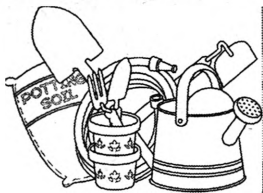


