Skate park: On a roll?

BUCKSPORT – Six Bucksport residents tonight (6/9) will roll out plans for building a small, but expandable, skatepark off Elm Street.

The Skate Bucksport Committee wants the Town Council to bankroll the estimated \$7,000 the group says it will cost to place a "halfpipe" mini-skateboard ramp on town-owned property between Ian's Playground and the town's baseball field. The site was used in the past for basketball hoops.

The skateboard group includes: Derek Cole, a self-described community organizer and father of two;

Keisha Evans, a social worker; Jamie Grindle, a home builder, and father of two; and three high school students – Aiden Carlson, Devin Gerow and Gage Worcester.

Specifically, the group wants to move a small section of the ramps used at a now-closed indoor skateboard center in Rye, NH. The starter park here – a section 16 feet wide, 24 feet long and 6 feet high – could be ready within weeks. The group also has included sketches of plans that eventually could expand the park, designs range in cost

from an estimated \$52,000 to one costing about \$200,000.

The committee is working with Beau Lambert, who was affiliated with the Rye operation but now is relocating his family to Orland. The New Hampshire venture collapsed as a result of several factors, including the economics brought on by the Covid pandemic.

The goal of the local group is to add another alternative for the town's youth, and provide a professionally designed place to skateboard rather than in the streets or on the town's sidewalks or parking lots. They say the initial halfpipe could last 20 to 30 years with minimal maintenance.

Cole said he believes the \$7,000 investment would result in big returns to the community, ranging from providing good exercise for young people to attracting more people to visit the town.

The council is expected to raise some questions about the monitoring and liability issues involved in operating a skatepark.

Administrative changes endorsed at RSU 25

BUCKSPORT – In a variation of "musical chairs" three RSU 25 educators have new roles in the management of the school system, effective July 1.

• Christina Ellis, the principal at the Miles Lane and G.H. Jewett schools, is moving to the central office as the curriculum coordinator. She succeeds Evelyn Beaulieu, who is retiring this month. The curriculum coordinator's job is listed in the 2021-2022 budget as paying \$98,230.

• Darcy Dakin, a resident of Searsport, will become the new principal of the Miles Lane and G.H. Jewett schools here. The schools house all of the classes between pre-kindergarten through the fourth grade. Dakin has a master's degree in educational leadership from the University of Maine. She earned \$60,825 working for the RSU this fiscal year, but now will earn more in her new assignment. The principal's position is in the new budget at \$97,280.

• And Amanda Roy will become the assistant principal at the Bucksport Middle School. The vice principal position is half-time so Roy will continue to teach mathematics at the school, also on a half-time basis. Among her assignments within the RSU Roy has taught fourth, fifth, sixth and eighth grade math classes at the middle school and done some work in special education.

The salaries for the next school year included 4 percent increases for most of the administrators with a 6 percent boost in the pay of the elementary school principal and 5.4 percent for the assistant principal and athletic director at the high school.

The teachers' union negotiated a 6 percent raise in each of the next three school years.

The appointments were endorsed by the RSU 25 School Board at a special meeting on Monday.

Councilors prompt cuts in some salary hikes

BUCKSPORT – The town councilors at their last session said that while they didn't object to some municipal administrators getting hefty raises to keep those posts financially competitive with other Maine communities, they wanted the proposed increases spread over at least three years.

After all, they reasoned, other town employees are slated to get 5 percent cost-of-living increases beginning July 1, so higher pay hikes for the top tier could cause friction among the rest of the employees.

Town Manager Susan M. Lessard offered to cut her own proposed raise from 5 percent to 3 percent and to again forego the \$5,000 in professional development expense reimbursement called for in her contract.

In an effort to keep the administrators' raises below 10 percent, Lessard

now is proposing these numbers for the ten highest paid municipal employees:

Town Manager – \$109,538, instead of \$111,700 plus the \$5,000 expense reimbursement.

Public Safety Director – \$96,873, not the \$105,400 originally recommended.

Deputy Police Chief, \$84,038

Deputy Fire Chief – \$84,038

Firefighter/Paramedic – \$76,093

Firefighter/Paramedic – \$74,805

Public Works Director \$74,458

Economic & Economic Development Director/Waterfront Mgr. – \$73,419

Police Sergeant – \$73,258

Firefighter/Paramedic – \$72,428

IN THE WORKS . . . Tidbits from week's news

FAIR WARNING! – Town Manager Susan M. Lessard has given the first public indication of when she may retire. During a review of part of the 2022-2023 budget she warned the councilors they should expect to add a budget director back to their town's staff when she departs at the start of the 2024-2025 fiscal year. Lessard has handled the budgeting duties as part of her management of the municipal operations.

Town Councilor Paul Bissonnette has in recent months warned his colleagues they should be better prepared to find a successor when Lessard retires than they did when the three previous managers left. After Roger R. Raymond retired, giving more than a year's notice, the council hired and dismissed two managers before hiring Lessard. Bissonnette

has supported Lessard but faults the panel for not fully reviewing the previous two managers before offering them contracts.

MORE FIREFIGHTERS? – The Bucksport Fire Department would like to hire three more firefighter/EMTs to guarantee a three-person crew is available at the firehouse 24/7/365 days a year. However, the town manager now is likely to suggest the increased staffing be phased in over the next two-or-so years with one person being added every six months or so to cushion the impact on the budget.

The deputy fire chief has reported the number of active on-call firefighters is declining, as it is at departments all over the state. Meanwhile the number of ambulance

calls is continuing to increase. Calling in ambulance personnel from other communities results in delayed responses, and that can be hazardous to those in crisis, Chief Michael Denning said.


MEETING CANCELLED The Town Council will not meet on June 23 but will call a special session on June 30 if one is needed before the start to the next fiscal year on July 1. Otherwise, the board is expected to set the tax rate at its first meeting in July. That rate currently is expected to increase the mil rate, requiring \$70 more in taxes from the owner of a property assessed at \$100,000.









Feinberg was a transplant to Maine from Georgia and Virginia at a young age. She studied studio art and journalism at the University of Maine, Orono. Feinberg now lives in the Portland area


with her husband, pianist, Jesse Feinberg.

Her book is the autobiographical poetry and short stories about a girl from the south transplanted to Maine at a young age who endured trauma and lived to tell about it.





Such events are not uncommon here, and that's a powerful testimony to this special place we call home.


Papers go missing enroute to Orland!

Library support more than doubling

BUCKSPORT — The Buck Memorial Library, which for years received \$14,000 annually from the Town of Bucksport, this year may be in line for \$30,000.

The private library, which is open to the public but is guided by a self-appointed all-volunteer board of trustees, sought the higher sum to support an expanded range of services under a new librarian.

In the past the entire operating budget of the library was about \$60,000-a-year, and included all expenses ranging from heat and lights to the two salaries — a figure made possible because neither of the then-librarian or assistant librarian received any benefits other than vacation pay.

In recent years the library also has done major fund raising to cover the cost of replacing the badly deteriorated brick wall underpinnings behind the granite

block exterior. This work was completed one wall at a time over several years.

Buck Memorial has an endowment, which at one point last year the treasurer of the organization estimated as "approaching \$1.5 million."

The new board of trustees to expanding and updating the library services, the trustees earlier this year sought \$52,000 from the town, but the Town Council took no action on that request.

In 2018, the library reported total expenses of \$154,000 but revenues of only \$95,600. Apparently the shortfall was covered by some of the \$56,000 the library earned on its investments that year. The library also recorded having assets of \$2,125,000, apparently a combination of the endowment and the value of the landmark building on Main Street.

Frederick A. Atwood, 1930 - 2022


PROSPECT-
