## Musicians strut their stuff

BUCKSPORT – Some of the finest trombone players in New England and beyond came together to make music, support a great cause and have a whole lot of fun in the process.

At the 35th annual edition of the Just for Fun Trombone Concert at the Elm Street Congregational Church on Saturday, the sanctuary was alive with the enthusiasm trombone players have for their instrument.

While many of the well-experienced musicians play a variety of instruments, there's something unique that occurs when "bones" players gather.

Operating with minimal rehearsal time earlier in the day, the trombonists offered up a very diverse program, to say the least. Indeed, the 90-minute concert ranged from Vivaldi to an African-American spiritual to swing dance tunes to a lively

march that had the audience looking for the unseen parade to join.

The proceeds from the evening, as usual, went to the church's account to maintain its historic E. & G.G. Hook pipe organ. The massive, 666-pipe instrument, in continuous use here since the Civil War, was showcased in the prelude to the concert.

In the audience were Clayton Rogers, now 95, of Brewer, who has played the Bucksport organ in the past, and Matthew Fleming of the Episcopal church who plays the organ each Sunday afternoon for the Anglican services.

David Friedell, who makes the 80-mile round trip from Stonington to Bucksport to serve as the organist and choir-master, formerly played the world's largest pipe organ, the one at the West Point Military Academy in New York State.

## Money to be offered to spiff up downtown

BUCKSPORT – The town is preparing to offer cash to downtown property owners to encourage them to spruce up the exteriors of their buildings.

The incentives will be offered on a dollar-for-dollar match basis, allowing a property owner to get twice as much work done for the same investment. A key change from previous town-sponsored efforts to do this, is the money will be offered to owners of both residential and commercial properties along Main Street from the traffic lights to the entrance to the former paper mill. The plan is part of an effort to recognize the area from Mechanic Street to the mill site as part of the downtown business district.

As discussed by the Community and Economic Development Committee this week, the tentative plan calls for allocating up to

\$100,000 over a one-year period. That could produce some \$200,000-or-more in new investments downtown.

The money would come from either the town's unallocated fund balance, a portion of the \$200,000-or-so that remains in tax incremental financing (TIF) proceeds, or some combination of both.

The development committee suggested that the grants also be made available to those planning improvements that would be visible from the Penobscot River Walkway and those whose properties have more than one exterior wall that is very visible to the public.

The money would not be offered for normal maintenance such as repairing or replacing a roof.

Applications will be available beginning September 1.

## Bucksport ... where some things don't change

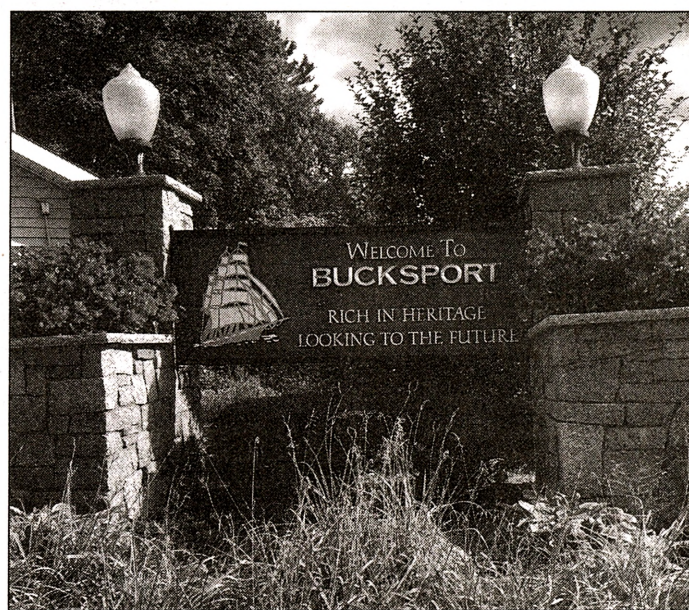
BUCKSPORT –

After months of pondering scores of alternative phrases to capture the essence of Bucksport, a key town committee this week voted to recommend the one the town has used for a quarter of a century.

The Town Council now will decide whether to stick with, "Rich in heritage, looking to the future." Those words were first posted in the mid-1990s.

With suggestions from dozens of residents, none drew more than a few votes, according to Richard Rotella, the town's director of community and economic development.

If the councilors concur, the phrase will anchor the town's latest multi-thousand dollar marketing campaign.

## IN THE WORKS ... Tidbits from week's news

**CULVERT #1** – The Jacob Buck Pond culvert project will begin on Monday, and will take approximately five weeks to complete. The road will be closed from after the first two houses from the Millvale Road intersection to just before Willis Road. Access to Willis Road and the rest of Jacob Buck Pond Road will be from Turkey Path.

**CULVERT #2** – The Silver Lake Road reclaim/grade/pave project will start next Monday. There will be flaggers

and the road will remain open but there may be delays. The project runs from the intersection of Millvale and Silver Lake to the power line just before the Silver Lake boat launch ramp.

**PERSONHOLE COVERS?** – You still may know them as manhole covers, and they're being raised after the repaving of many of the in-town streets. There has been difficulty in acquiring the covers because of shortages in the supply chain.

**RETIRING** – Peter Farragher, executive director of the Down East YMCA, is retiring in January 2023. He has served the "Y" for 24 years. The "Y" staff will continue to oversee Bucksport's recreation programming.

**WALL BUILDING** – Bids for phase 2 of the retaining wall replacement project are in hand, and will be on the Town Council agenda for awarding next Thursday (8/25).

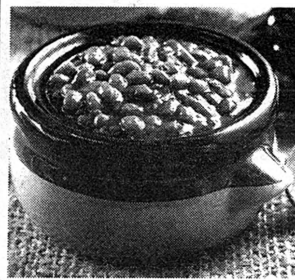

**JED PROUTY ASSISTED LIVING** – Magnolia Care Homes has acquired the business assets of the Jed Prouty Assisted Living Facility effective August 1, 2022, and also has a ten year lease of the building/real estate – which remains in the ownership of Chambers Realty LLC. The microloan on the property was paid off at the time of the business assets transfer. The terms of the forgivable loan 15 year loan issued by the Town in 2011 remain as they are since the Chambers continue to own the property and it will continue to be operated as an assisted living facility.

**NOMINATION PAPERS** – A reminder that nomination papers are available for two (2) Town Council seats and one school board seat. Papers can be picked up Monday through Thursday from 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. and must be returned by 5:30 p.m. on September 8th.

**RESIGNED** – Mary Powell, the executive director of the private Main Street Bucksport downtown development group, has resigned the part-time post, effective Sept. 1.

Powell, a Bucksport High School graduate and the daughter of Joe and Valerie Sulya, retired town nurse of Bucksport, first worked for the Northern Light medical system at the Maine Coast Memorial

Hospital in Ellsworth. She took on the part-time job here. She now wants to pursue other interests while still working at the hospital.

**OLD BANK** – The opening of the coffee cafe in the Old Bank building on Main Street has been delayed until at least the end of the year because of the need for renovations and the recruitment of an adequate staff to operate the new business year-round. The building was purchased some months ago by a Castine couple, who already operate a similar business on a seasonal basis in Bar Harbor. They plan to operate a coffee roaster in the basement and serve food and beverages on the ground floor. The business also has

to be cleared by the Planning Board, which is expected.

**WINE RESTAURANT** – The new owners of the Masonic Building at Franklin and Elm streets say it could take two years to prepare the structure for its new uses. They plan to operate a wine bar-style food business in the basement. They also plan to reside on the main floor and rent the second floor as an apartment. The building reportedly sold for slightly more than \$150,000. The local Masonic lodge moved out.

The new plans are subject to Planning Board and also Town Council approvals, both of which are expected.

# Public needs to know

Let's not quibble about any distinctions between the words "search" and "raid," but instead focus on whether the Federal Bureau Investigation's confiscation of records from the Florida home of former President Donald Trump last week constitutes a profound assault on the fourth amendment to the U.S. Constitution.

That's the amendment that states, "The right of the people to be secure in their persons, houses, papers, and effects, against unreasonable searches and seizures, shall not be violated, and no warrants shall issue, but upon probable cause, supported by oath or affirmation, and particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized."

**EDITORIAL**

The answer to that at this point still is unknown despite all of the posturing, blustering and pontificating on both sides of the nation current political divide. One side is in high dudgeon over the unknowns, while the other is saying nothing significant to clarify this unprecedented action.

Ordinarily the public could sit back and wait for the situation to play out, but three factors are overriding: (1) The seizure by armed FBI agents of records from the private home of a former president of this nation is unprecedented. (2) The track record of the FBI and the U.S. Justice Department in processing politically sensitive cases in recent years has been atrocious, tarnishing their reputations for treating everyone equally. And (3) we are less than two months from an especially contentious mid-term election, balloting likely to impact the 2024 presidential race.

U.S. Attorney General Merrick Garland owes the public far more than he has delivered so far on the odd timing and actions taken at Mar-a-Lago under his command.

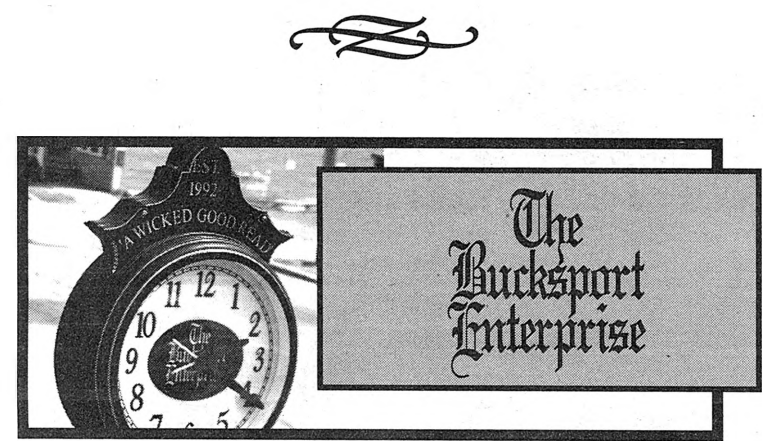
U.S. Sen. Susan Collins, (R-ME) said as much when she highlighted a letter to Garland and others from Senate Select Committee on Intelligence Chairman Mark Warner (D-VA) and Vice Chairman Marco Rubio (R-FL) to Attorney General Merrick Garland and others requesting information relating to the FBI's nine hours at Mar-a-Lago last week.

A member of that Senate panel, Collins said, "The American people deserve a full accounting of the extraordinary action taken by the FBI last week. I am encouraged that following consultation with Senate Intelligence Committee members, Chairman Warner and Vice Chairman Marco Rubio have requested critical information related to the FBI's search of former President Trump's residence.

"It's imperative that the committee receive all classified documents found during the search as well as the FBI affidavit, which would describe in detail any justification for the search.

"I look forward to the . . . swift compliance with the committee's request, which is essential to promoting transparency and securing a full accounting of the FBI's unprecedented search of a former president's personal residence."

If a crime or crime has been committed, prosecute it. If, once again, the Justice Department finds it does not have the evidence to do that, the agency's top brass should admit that. They also should apologize, and not just to the former president.

Drive by the old guardhouse where workers at the former Bucksport mill made world class paper for the better part of a century and you might think nothing is going on. You would be wrong. It may have fallen silent since the demolition of the mill but the noise can be heard and read as a group devoted to establishing the Bucksport Paper Mill Museum works to bring it about. While the Historical Society's banner proclaiming "Home of the Future Bucksport Paper Mill Museum" was shredded by fierce winter winds, the effort it announced has withstood the delays of big industry in getting the property deeded to the Historical Society. And while the Society has awaited the completion of a survey and transfer of the deed, September marks the conclusion of a year-long Labor Day to Labor Day Founders Fund campaign reaching a \$10,000. goal that will enable the historic guardhouse, being sold to the Society for one dollar by Iron Clad Energy, to be insured and renovation to begin. An exhibit in the window of the Community Pharmacy shows what's been going on.

All who donate any amount, however modest, are being listed as Founders into the future and receiving hand-lettered keepsake certificates designed by Bucksport businessman and artist, Larry Wahl.

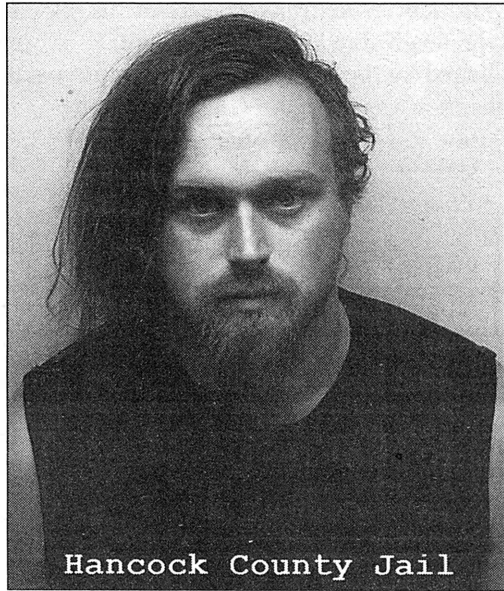
## Investigation by Bucksport Police Department leads to arrest for sexual misconduct

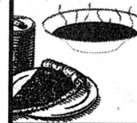

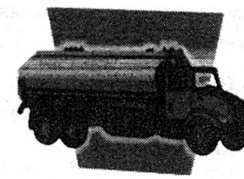


