Fatal Accident.
The express train for Worcester over the Portland & Rochester railroad yesterday afternoon, struck and killed Mr. Albert Guppy, of East Rochester, who was walking on the track, at a point about one mile east of East Rochester station. Mr. Guppy was over 70 years of age and was lame in his right leg. He was killed by a heavy box car, which was moving at a rapid pace. The train was stopped at once, and the body was removed to the hospital. The cause of the accident is being investigated.

Killed by an Insane Man.
Daniel T. Thompson, of North Yarmouth, aged 83 years, who was assaulted by Bert Reed, an insane man, some days ago, died of his injuries yesterday morning. Reed had been committed to the insane asylum. The funeral of the deceased will be held Saturday afternoon at 2 o'clock.

CITY GOVERNMENT.

Special Meeting of the City Council Last Evening.

The Sum of \$3,500 Appropriated to Repair Vaughan's Bridge.

All Bids for Changing the Casco Engine House Rejected.

A special meeting of the City Council was held last evening to take action on the unfavorable condition of the draw on Vaughan's bridge.

In board of Mayor and Aldermen. Alderman Gately, chairman of the committee on streets, made a statement of the condition in which the committee on streets, sidewalks and bridges found the draw on Vaughan's bridge. The draw is unsafe, and a body has been up that the new draw must be built. The committee on streets cannot spare from their appropriation the sum required to build a new draw, from \$300 to \$500; and they want the City Council to appropriate the sum required for the new draw. The committee on streets, however, are already expending \$25,000 on the contingent fund, and if there isn't abundant money in the contingent fund to take the \$300 needed for the new draw, the Mayor stated that the \$3,500 reserve was taken from the contingent fund, and \$1,000 more has been voted from it. This leaves \$4,500 to provide against all contingencies. The Mayor thought the \$4,000 voted to build an addition to Casco engine house and the \$500 voted for the new draw, would be sufficient to take the \$3,500 needed for the new draw.
