

HOUSES QUATTERED AND PEOPLE

Immense Damage by Lightning in Ontario and Quebec.

An Entire Family Killed by the Boiling Water of a Geyser Which Destroyed Their Home.

Particulars of the Loss in Life and Property.

MONTREAL, Aug. 17.—The thunder storm which passed over Eastern Ontario and Quebec last night and early this morning was the most terrific ever known here. Hundreds of houses and barns were blown down, the crops in many places were entirely destroyed. Horses and cattle by the thousands were killed and many people were lost. Reports are just being coming in from the surrounding country. At a small village called St. Louis de Gonzague, Capital of the Province of Quebec, a family was sitting in the kitchen when several bolts struck the house at the same time. The building seemed to collapse and caught fire. A flood of rain, however, extinguished the

The villagers were not panic stricken and dragged the family from under the debris. While none had been hurt by the falling house, all had been struck by lightning bolts. The father, the wife and the daughter instantly and the daughter cannot live.
