Inviting All Kids to Sail

There's magic to discovering life on a lake, there's adventure to skimming along with the wind, there's contentment to gliding serenely across a broad expanse of water and accomplishment to maneuvering through the challenging narrows.

Sailing is a world that people learn about and love. It is a lifetime, individual sport, a builder of character and self-confidence. And, it is a social outlet across the country and the continents.

Sailing can be learned at any age. There are lessons for adults available locally with the Great Pond Yacht Club (GPYC), but it's the area's youth

that sailing enthusiasts and youth leaders in the Belgrades region and beyond want to introduce to the sport, to add this lasting positive dimension to their lives.

Building on the current Youth Sailing Program established in 2014 at Belgrade's Center for All Seasons, their goal is to create more awareness among local residents, especially kids, through a tighter relationship among the Great Pond Yacht Club, the Center for All Seasons and the Town of Belgrade.

Through an administrative arrangement with SailMaine, which is based in Portland, the exist-

ing summer sailing program holds classes 5 days a week during 6 one-week courses, 2 sessions per day. From 9 am-12 noon, youth 8 through 12 years of age meet, and from 1-4 pm, youth 12 through 17 years of age meet, using a fleet of boats purchased by the GPYC and donated to SailMaine.

This summer the classes are being taught by a dynamic duo, sisters Olivia and Annabelle Nolan, college freshmen, who grew up sailing on Great Pond and who took the Belgrade sailing classes. Enthusiastic instructors, they also have

proven adept at providing alternative sail activities in the program's cozy base cottage during inclement weather (i.e. downpours) or when there is no wind.

Lessons might require wind but they don't necessarily require money to register. Children, especially teens, and of course their parents should know that there are scholarships available for lessons through SailMaine, the Union Church in Belgrade Lakes and the Great Pond Yacht Club.

According to Dan MacGlashing, Director of Belgrade's Parks & Recreation, "I just want kids to have an opportunity for recreation." In regard to scholarships for the sailing program, he states, "I'm going to facilitate this as much as I can."

With 60 slots out of a total of 72 filled this summer, there is room for expansion. There is one week left to inquire about vacancies. And then, there is next summer.

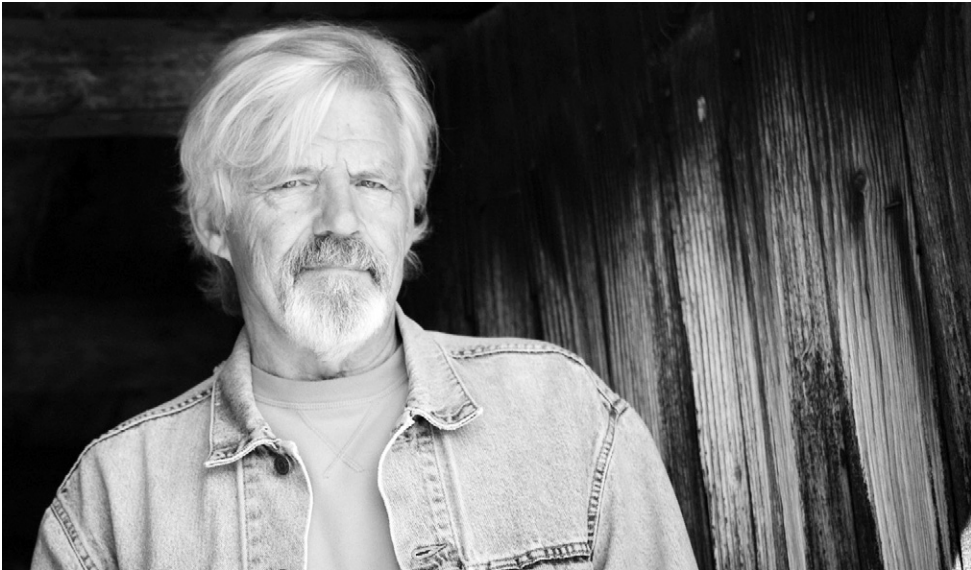

From Playwright to Novelist:
Oscar Winner Ernest Thompson
Presents His New Book August 19

Ernest Thompson, winner of an Academy Award for the movie On Golden Pond, will return to the Belgrades on Saturday, August 19 to present his first novel, The Book of Maps. The event will take place at 4 pm at the Belgrade Community Center for All Seasons.

Thompson, whose family connection to Great Pond began in 1908 and who has had a lifetime of summers there, will discuss and read from his

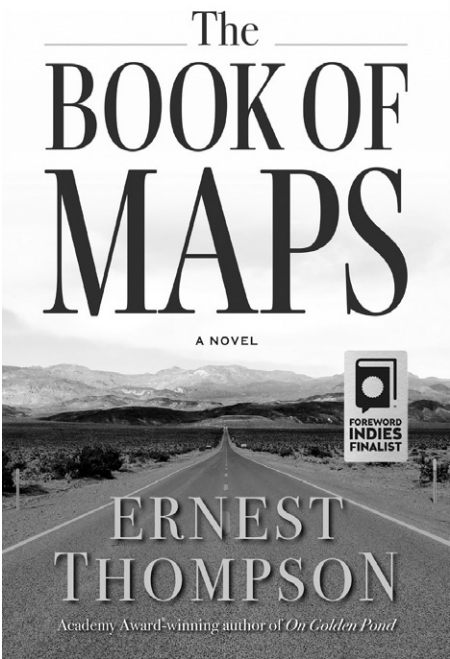
new novel, The Book of Maps, available for purchase (or bring your own copy) and signing by the author, and will also answer questions about On Golden Pond, the play and the making of the movie.

The Book of Maps is the tale of a father, taking his 10-year-old son on a cross-country trip from Los Angeles to New Hampshire, covering 16 states in 15 days. It's also the interior journey of the dad trying to find the best time to break the news to his son that the parents are ending their marriage.

Released last fall, The Book of Maps has been featured on a countrywide book tour. "I welcome the opportunity to engage with folks who love compelling stories as much as I do," Thompson says.

After 5 decades as an actor, playwright, director and scriptwriter, Thompson brings a legacy of writing experience and no shortage of anecdotes to the presentation of The Book of Maps.

The Book of Maps event is free and open to the public and will include an auction of On Golden Pond memorabilia donated by Thompson from his personal collection with all book and auction proceeds benefiting the Belgrade Lakes Association.

Colby Students Continue Legacy of Lake Science with 7 Lakes Alliance

For more than a decade, 7 Lakes Alliance has partnered with Colby College to better understand the ecology of the Belgrade Lakes watershed and to develop exceptional research, education, innovative approaches, and guidance for the community.

The 7 Lakes Alliance and Colby College partnership provides students with real-world experience, a research laboratory, field station, conference space, and teaching resources. A multi-disciplinary team of Colby faculty across disciplines, including, biology, chemistry, economics, geology, and social sciences, collaborate with 7 Lakes Alliance to engage citizens, lake associations, the Maine Department of Environmental Protection, and others in studying and protecting the Belgrade Lakes region. According to Dr. Danielle Wain, Lake Science Director at 7 Lakes, "Science and community are the cornerstones of our work to restore and protect our lands and waters."

A cadre of Colby students work throughout the academic year and during the summer to help support 7 Lakes Alliance's conservation strategies throughout the watershed. Colby interns gain valuable practical experience as they work to promote environmental stewardship practices to sustain healthy, vibrant lakes. Chemistry student Grady Florance, Class of '24 shared: "Being able to actually apply what we've learned in school to the greater Maine community by working on the lakes has been really fulfilling."

With training from 7 Lake's Dr. Danielle Wain and her fellow Lake Scientist, Lizzy Gallagher, six Colby students worked this summer on all 7 lakes to help determine current conditions. In just 10 weeks the students collected 600+ water samples for nutrient analysis, processed 75 algae samples via the Flowcam Cyano (7 Lake's new state-of-the-art algal imaging system) to determine algal levels in the lakes, and took over 110 water clarity readings. The students also worked on individual research projects. Topics ranged from nutrient analysis, using big data to predict a certain type of algal bloom, the use of AI in predicting water clarity, alum treatment research (sediment, zooplankton and user impacts), algal technology comparisons and more! Students honed their science communication skills at each of the boat launches, conversing about the lakes with community members.

The good health of the lands and the waters of the Belgrade Lakes region supports the economic infrastructure of the area. Dr. Danielle Wain added: "A healthy watershed benefits everyone in our community by supporting local commerce, recreation and tourism." Most importantly, these students continue a conservation legacy to ensure a healthy Belgrade Lakes region for generations to come.

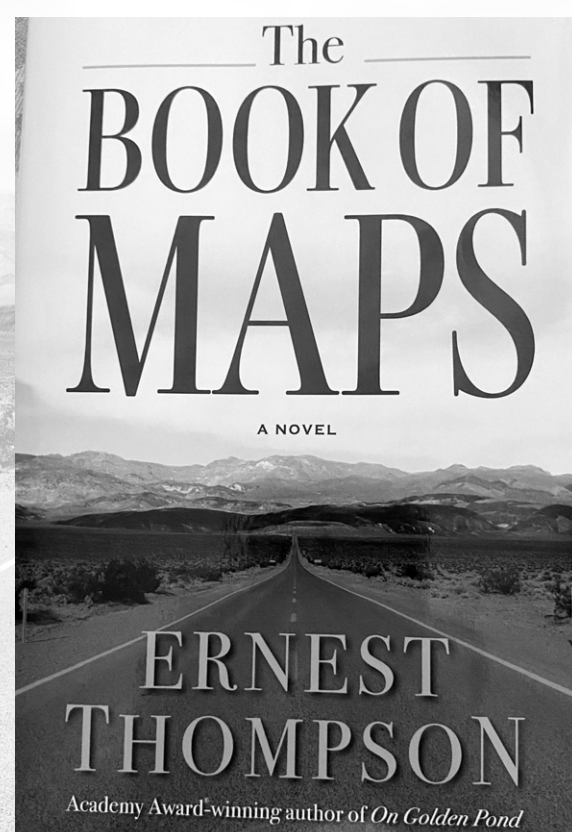

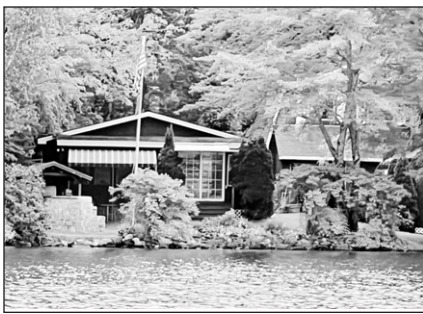
Take advantage of the rest of the summer and get out on the lakes or hike or bike in the hills. And

Skowhegan Falls History Walk in Celebration of Skowhegan’s Bicentennial

In celebration of Skowhegan’s Bicentennial Melvin Burnham, local historian, will lead a history walk at Skowhegan Falls Thursday, August 24th 10:00 am, beginning at the Benedict Arnold Park behind the Federated Church, Island Avenue, Skowhegan.

once could only be accessed by rowboat, canoe, or bateaux. Native Americans used it for fishing, resting, growing crops, and gathering mineral resources for their weapons. Now thousands of vehicles cross this 12-acre island every day.

The old Spinning Mill, built in 1922, is currently being repurposed as housing units, a hotel, and a brewery. If the conditions are right tour participants will be offered a chance to look inside this project to see how an historic structure can be reconstructed and continue to serve the community.

Many of the photos shared in this walk originated from the H. A. Wyman Collection assembled by Roland Taylor Patten (1864 - 1913), an early editor/owner of the Independent- Reporter and avid cyclist. Prior to his involvement in the Independent-Reporter photos used in the paper were discarded after use. Mr. Patten, realizing their value, decided to save them and over the years collected numerous photos depicting early Skowhegan history. Upon selling his interest in the newspaper and moving away, Mr. Patten secured funds from H. A. Wyman to assemble his image collection in binders and labeled each with valuable information. The Wyman Collection is now housed at the Skowhegan History House Museum & Research Center.

The ninety-minute walk will be tailored to participants’ needs and interests. Participants are welcome to bring and use lightweight folding chairs for their comfort and use their cameras along the way.

Join the tour and take a step back in time to see why Skowhegan Falls was and continues to be an important historic district in this community. (Images (1&3) from the Skowhegan History House Museum & Research Center Wyman Collection.)

This history walk offers participants in-depth information with vintage images that illustrate what role Skowhegan Island and Skowhegan Falls played in the development of industry and culture on the Kennebec River during the 19th century. Participants will learn what it was like to live and work in this era; how the power of moving water can shape the destiny of a community. This island

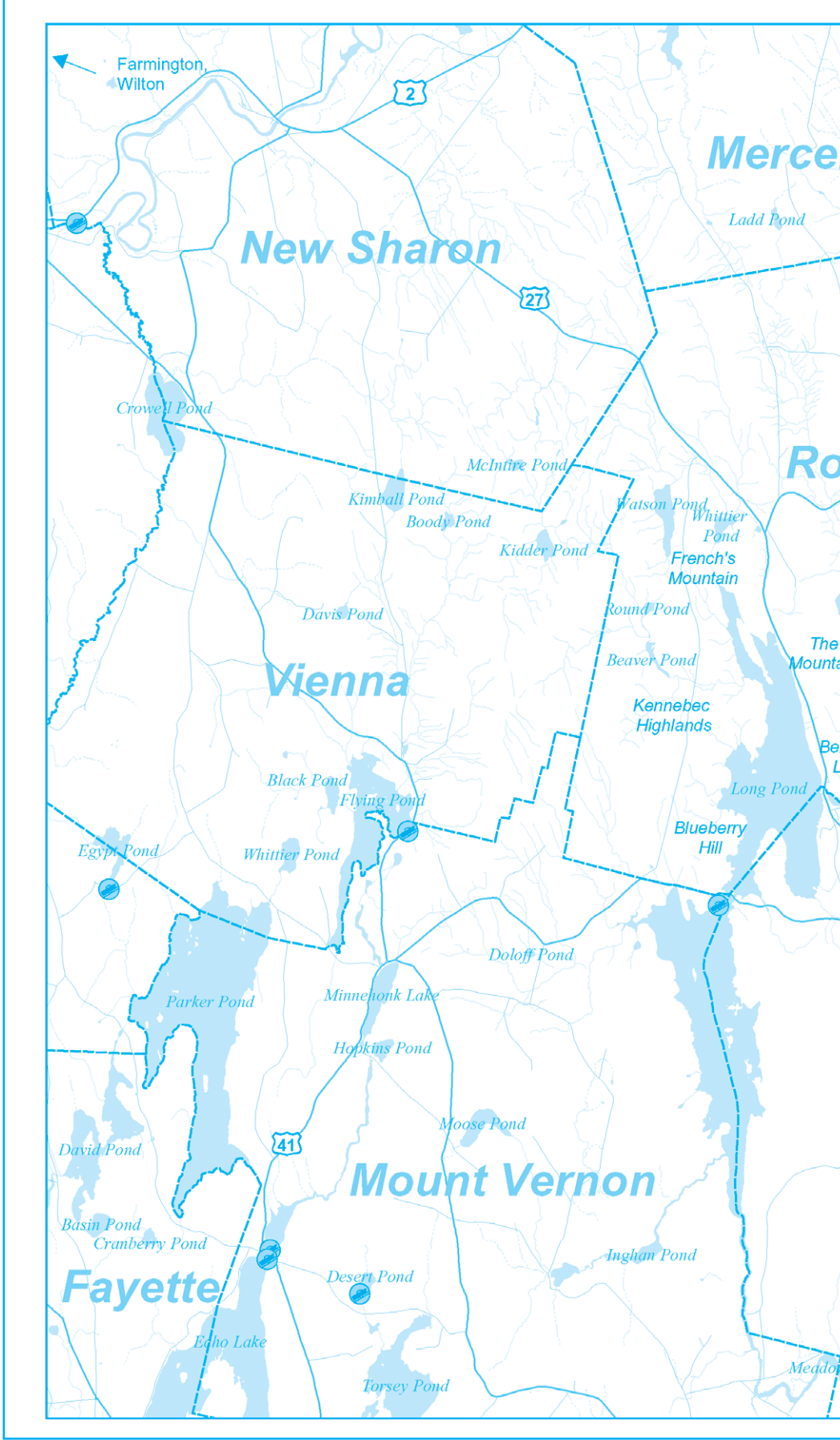

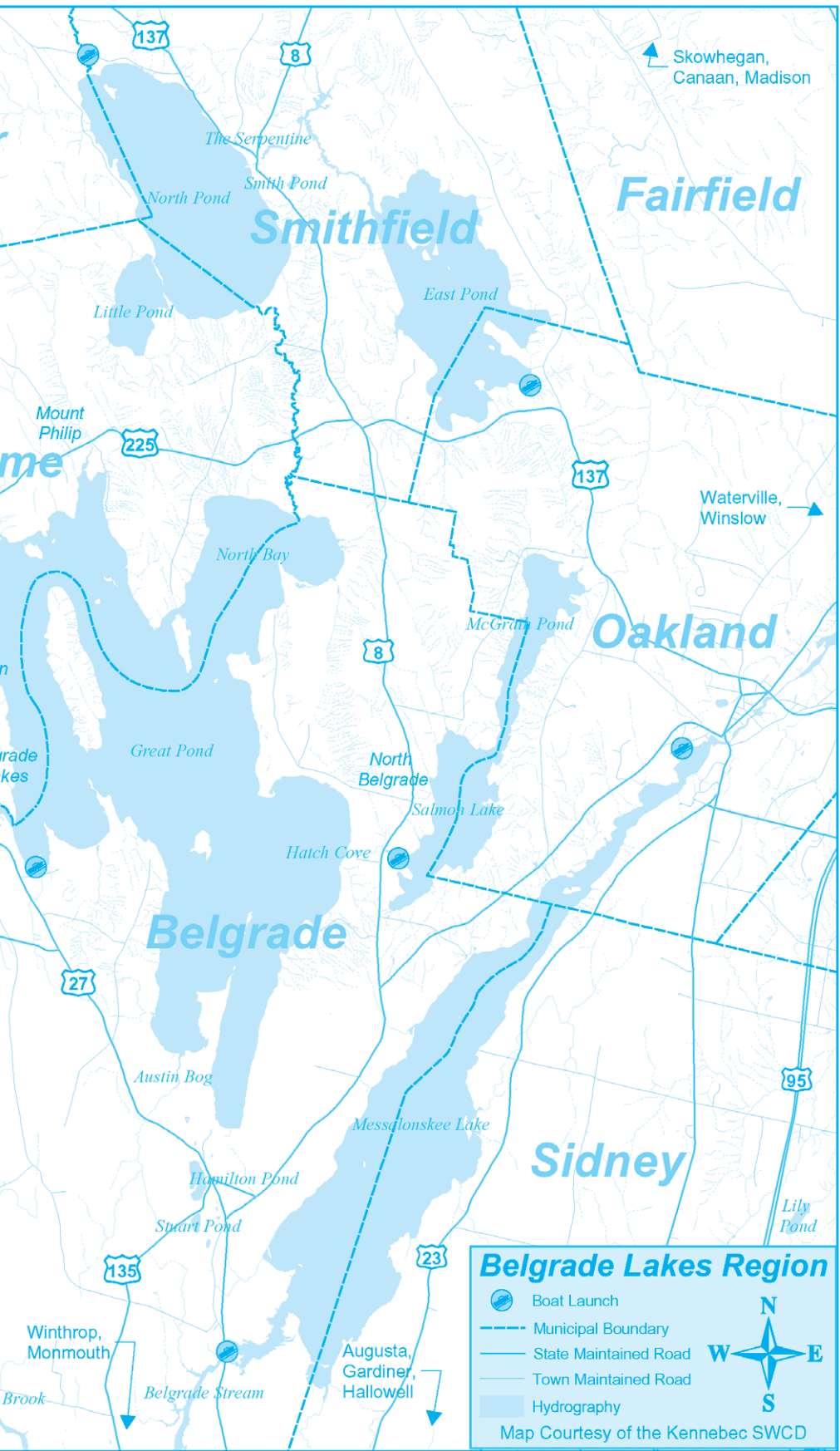

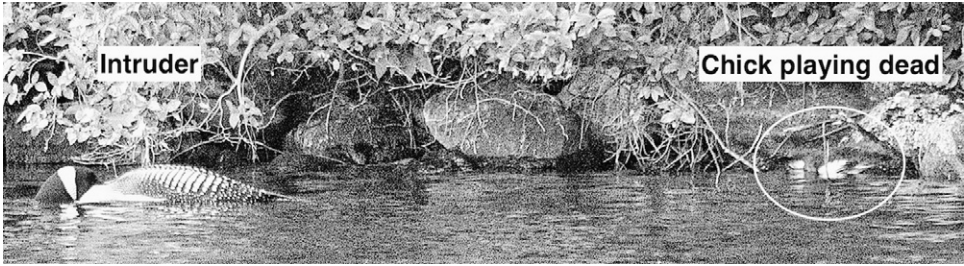

Call of the Loon



Saving a Loon Chick on Long Pond



Well, we scored another first yesterday morning while heading out on upper Long Pond with BLA's illustrious Loon Project crew, consisting of loon

expert, Lee Attix, Colby College interns, Kate Jaffe and Brynne Robbins and yours truly. We were not 50 yds from the dock when Lee observed one of our two Tracy Cove chicks up against the shore approximately 100 yds away. We motored over and within three to four minutes, there were numerous splashes and our chick disappeared! Less than 30 seconds later, an adult popped up but still no chick. Where did this adult come from? What happened to our chick? MASS PANIC SET IN!! As the adult swam maybe 5 yds away, we noticed the chick washed up against the shore.

The only adult that should have been this deep in the territory with a lone chick should have been one of the two recently banded parents but this adult loon was an un-banded intruder that came in to dispatch the chick!!! The intruder then went over to the chick and pecked its head with the chick appearing dead. Didn't move a feather! We brought the boat right in to the chick and as Lee attempted to pick up the chick with a jacket, the chick came alive!!!

It was feigning dead even as this intruder pecked its head. We felt our only alternative was to capture the chick to protect it from this intruder and hopefully

reunite it with his/her sibling and parent(s). We placed the chick, wrapped in a towel, into a cooler and set out to find the rest of the family.

Approximately a mile down the lake we located the sibling and banded female, aka. "mother". YEAH!!!! Now the interesting part!! Lee reached over the bow to release our rescued chick and he/she immediately spun around and not once, not twice, but three times, trying to get a piece of Lee!!! So much for gratitude!! With Lee running for cover (not really!), the chick dove and swam over to join his/her sibling and mother.

Our 'Rescuee' immediately tried to intervene in the feeding but mother ignored him for the first ten

The Dams Keeper Report

As I write this week's column, your all volunteer Dams Committee got caught with their proverbial pants down!! We've had numerous close calls this summer but fortunately the Belgrade Lakes have avoided the severe flooding that many of our neighbors up North and East of us endured. Well, we got nailed this time with 4 inches of rain in less than 24 hrs., bringing Long Pond up a whopping 12", Great Pond 7", and Salmon, McGrath and Messalonskee, 6" each. We were prepared for an inch or two but not the 4" we received, unfortunately, resulting in washing out several of our neighbors' docks. Seeing that we were going to get slammed, we promptly opened the gates but by then, it was a little too late, for which we apologize. We've been in the "Save the Water" mode for so long that it was not easy to switch gears, especially with so many recent false warnings. As we are now on the back side of the Dog Days of Summer, and with the threat of a drought lessening, we will be allowing

our water levels to recede a bit so we will better be able to handle these flash floods in the future.

In the meantime, we are bringing our water levels back down to just full pond as soon as we can. As I write this column, Snow Pond is again, remarkably at 2.52" below full due to their electricity generation and ability to handle a lot of water. Great Pond is today at 6.72" above full with one gate opened just 2' to not further add to Long Pond's misery. Long Pond, at the Wings Mill Dam, is 2.76" above full with both gates wide open. Upper Long Pond is currently a whopping 10" above full due to its steep watershed. Salmon, is also slowly coming down and is now 4.5" below full pond. Without any further deluges, it will take a couple of weeks to bring things back down to 'normal'.

Good Prose by Tracy Kidder and Richard Todd

"The Art of Nonfiction" grabbed me because of having read and remembered Tracy Kidder's Mountains Beyond Mountains AND Strength in What Remains. Both riveting stories about monumental people and events you never heard of, at least I had not.

Among the public library shelves, this shiny covered new book published in 2013, was there for me to check out. New England favorite authors are within: Stephen King's On Writing is listed in the selective bibliography, Henry David Thoreau explored on five pages AND our very own E.B.White on four pages along with his professor Strunk on two additional pages.

I did enjoy reading how these two friends and writers over three decades long, grew into this book of knowledge about writing investigative journalism and the editing process. For Kidder to switch places in the writing process with his editor Richard Todd is a revealing informative tunnel to tour.

Much is written about my favorite prior reads by Kidder: Strength AND Mountains. Good to reread how these two masterpieces came to be.

"Deo's travail, spending time with him in New York and Boston, interviewing people who had helped him, and traveling with him to Burundi and Rwanda."

"Most important, retelling the story in first person helped the reader see...what the book was really about. It was not just about extraordinary resilience and courage, but also about memory and how the mind can work to repair itself after devastating experience."

How very helpful to find how health can be healing after time passes, even after Deo's devastating experiences here in the US, many seemed third-world to me in their depravity.

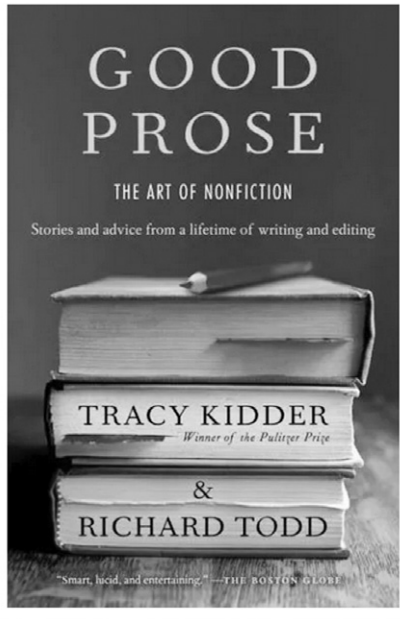
"The central figure in the story, Dr. Paul Farmer, was not...particularly famous...What Kidder realized finally was that he had to be a stand-in for the skeptical reader...Thus Kidder for the first time portrayed himself, registering the discomfort and diminishing skepticism that he had felt while traveling with Farmer."

"One of the side effects of saints (Farmer) is that they can make the rest of us feel crummy, or even annoyed...Paul Farmer is revealed to us through the growing comprehension of the narrator."

The Elements of Style by Strunk and White was my bible while in college. Little did I know then that I would live summers on Great Pond where E.B.White spent August delight from age six onwards. Charlotte's Web was introduced to me in children's lit class around 1969 or thereabouts. Just that one book through the years of teaching public school kids in Md. is enough to stamp anyone's heart.

When I finally discovered the "Once more to the lake" essay and its numerous rewrites, I had experienced decades at Little Sebago with family in various rental cottages. We returned year after year to a spot of heaven where "things don't change much." Little did I know that we would buy an old camp on Great Pond with Girls Camp Runoia as our neighbor.

Then the mailboat came by our dock everyday. Oops, On Golden Pond



again. I bet Ernest Thompson honored the advice of Strunk and White with "Omit needless words."

Think about "suck face" in On Golden Pond. How brief can one be with Old Poop and the young toughie from CA.

"In his introduction to *The Elements of Style*, E. B. White suggests that the reader is always in danger of confusion. The reader is 'a man floundering in a swamp,' and it falls to the writer...to 'drain this swamp quickly and get his man up on dry ground, or at least throw him a rope.'"

Henry David Thoreau, who explored our Kennebec River and up north on many New England ventures, wrote, "I wish to speak a word for Nature, for absolute Freedom and Wildness, as contrasted with a Freedom and Culture merely civil...'Walking' debuted as a lecture in 1851...All its experience can be brought to bear; no subject is too small to notice or too big to contemplate. Emerson wrote even more expansively..."

More New England writers, Emerson, too. Read this great book about writing, and take a walk with our poets, "This is the forest primeval," as Mom and I walked around Little Lake Sebago and many Belgrade walkers do Point Road near Runoia everyday with tall pines providing cool shade on the hottest summer day.

Cool off in the lake and remember E.B.White did his daily canoe paddles near shady shores and enjoying the quiet big blue waters. He even took his son Joe to Bear Springs where morning swims brought out the goose bumps for both father and son.

Good Prose is "Stories and advice from a lifetime of writing and editing," by Pulitzer Prize writer Tracy Kidder and his editor Richard Todd. Rich stories and rich writing, indeed.

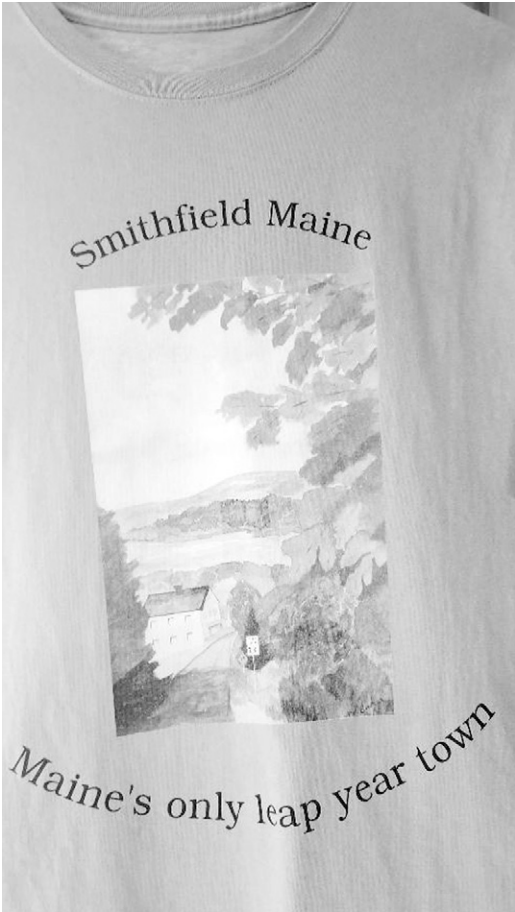
