REVIEW OF PORTLAND WHOLESALE MARKET.

FOR THE WEEK ENDING AUG. 29.

Very few changes will be noted in prices for the week under review, but business continues satisfactory with a firm feeling in values generally. The wheat market has been quiet and steady all the week. The statistical position of the market is little changed in the hands of all interested in the present improvement has been continued. Flour is very firm and a further advance is reported in prices. Millers are indifferent about selling at current prices, but many of them have their production sold ahead. Sugar was a little earlier in the week, but the market closed today steady at 7 1/2c for granulated, large. For extra C, stock in the four ports at 7 1/2c. Sugar was 86c for tons against 106.00 for in 1887 and 107.75 for tons, total stock in all the principal countries 775,824 tons against 830,014 tons last year. Molasses is steady; stock in the four ports at latest dates was 26,022 hogshead against 27,000 hogshead in 1887 and 26,000 hogshead in 1886. Coffee is steady and quiet at quotations. For fish trade is moderate and prices are lower on cod and haddock; large Shore Cod is now quoted at 4 1/2c for 4 1/2c.
