The Awesome Life of the Access User

Boats parked in driveways, fishing gear stowed in cars, kayaks on a vehicle roof and floatees packed in picnic baskets. They're all part of the life of Maine lake access users, residents who don't own lakefront property but participate in the unique privilege that Maine's waters are so accessible.

According to state studies: "well over 200,000 Maine adults are access users on lakes annually. About 78% swim, 64% recreate near the shore, 49% fish from a boat and roughly 40% use powerboats and canoes. Maine resident access users spend as much as \$153 million annually on their recreation, 59% of which is spent in the communities nearest those lakes. This use supports as

many as 3,000 jobs (lake use in general supports more than 8000 Maine jobs) and generates in excess of \$30 million income for Maine residents."

There are no statistics for the remarkable value in lifestyle enjoyment and life enrichment of access users nor statistics about youth access users who follow in their adults' footsteps but state studies have found that access users place substantial value, in excess of the cost to them, on the lakes they use for swimming, boating, fishing, etc.

Studies aside, access use of the Belgrade lakes and surrounding watersheds appears significant and everyone who passes area parks with their

inviting picnic tables, drives these roads with their priceless water views, stops at mini-markets crowded with day users refueling their vehicles, boats and themselves recognizes that the culture of the access user is a familiar part of lake life in Maine. Almost all the lakes and ponds have boat launches, most of the towns have lake access and there an abundance of parks of all sizes where users are welcome.

Although access commonly brings to mind public boat landings, everyone who lives among the lakes can be aware of anglers casting off the side of the road, of cars parked near where almost obscure word-of-mouth trails lead to

Sharing the roads... Maine's roads are public ways and horse-drawn carriages and wagons using them are protected by law. Motorists are required to stop when requested to by the horse's attendant and wait until given the go-ahead, especially if the animal is disturbed.

Other laws include: don't use vehicle horns around animals; don't rev engines; turn off high beams; and, when passing, allow a 3-foot clearance (more is better). In a recent incident, a passing vehicle pulled the back left wheel off an Amish horse-drawn wagon; much worse accidents have happened.

Remember, the roads are shared with our Amish neighbors.

great swimming holes, of kids jumping off bridges (not recommended but access it is), of elderly couples picnicking in the cooling breeze or of youngsters splashing excitedly at the water's

edge of a lakeside park. Access is land access, too, and this region abounds with public trails. With their varying lengths and levels of difficulty they offer one of the easiest introductions to outdoor recre-

ation and they encourage families of all ages and sizes to walk and hike together.

The challenge for access use is not how much it gets users outdoors, not how it is the key to a lifetime pursuit, not how much fun it is or how it can be a family or intergenerational outlet but how to let nonusers know about all the wonderful waters and trails and communities that are so nearby.

Here's to a summer that's still starting up and the possibilities for welcoming access users to an awesome outdoors.

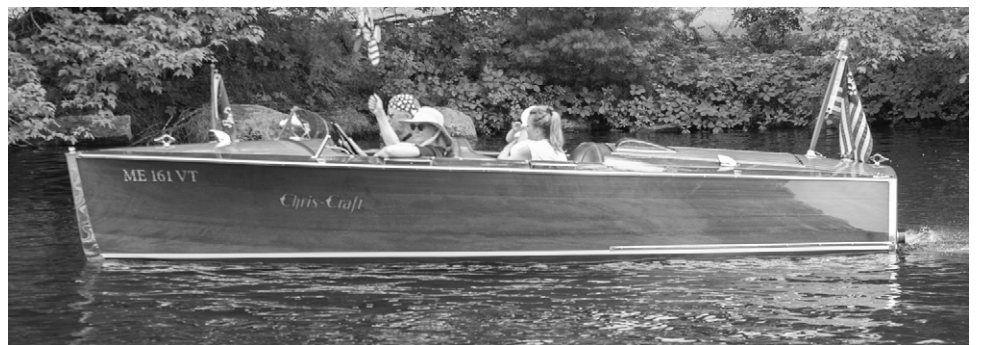

Calling All Boat-Parade Watchers



Everyone loves a good parade, especially a good boat parade and one of the best is coming up on Thursday, July 4 in Belgrade Lakes.

If the past is any indication, there will be family (pontoon) and party boats, speed boats, maybe a fire boat, angler boats, rubber boats, boats piloted by dogs (or so it seems), paddle boats, the occasional canoe or kayak and the spectators' favorites - antique boats, with antique motors.

It's no accident that so many antique boats are in the parade. Many of them are owned and coveted by residents of Great Pond and have plied these waters for years.

Others are Great Pond guests for the day, the passion of a unique group of collectors who are statewide members of the Pine Tree Boating Club, the local branch of the national Antique Outboard Motor Club, Inc. (AOMCI).

Throughout the boating months, when the call goes out, the members show up on a variety of lakes in Maine. There's a code for when and where and a few simple instructions, mostly like bring your own food.

For the Belgrade Lakes 4th of July Boat Parade, the code is Pete's Place. Pete's is a rallying point starting at 4 am. At 10 am the floating antique collection heads to the parade line-up at the mouth of the Belgrade Stream and from then on its 2 miles of pure participation enjoyment past historic boat houses, lily pads and kids wading on the edge of the steam.

Local docks that have been offered as public viewing sites will be crowded with spectators. Local ducks who own the stream will paddle helter-skelter. Cameras will click. And, the occasional water gun will add an element of friendly fire suspense.

The boat parade is scheduled for 12 noon. For more information about the Pine Tree Boating Club visit www.pinetreeboating.com.

7 Lakes Alliance Reports on EARLY EMERGENCE OF CYANOBACTERIA

In the wake of recent extreme temperatures, many concerned citizens are reporting green scum on their shorelines, particularly on North Pond, Great Pond and Long Pond. 7 Lakes Alliance's Dr. Danielle Wain tested samples this week and confirmed that what people thought might be pine pollen on many shorelines was actually cyanobacteria (also known as blue green algae). This type of cyanobacteria is called Dolichospermum and has the potential to produce algal toxins. It is typically seen much later in the summer. While testing done by 7 Lakes in the past has yet to detect algal toxins in our lakes, we always caution to stay out of the water with blue green algae, particularly children and dogs who can ingest a lot of water when swimming. The scums are mostly present on the shorelines where it accumulates, driven by the wind, so open waters tend to be clearer for recreation. Cooler temperatures and rain, predicted to follow the recent hot weather will help dissipate the scums in most locations until warmer weather arrives.

- Dolichospermum spends the beginning of its life cycle in the lake sediments, where it finds phosphorus needed to grow. When the weather gets

warmer, it leaves the sediment and enters the water. While it is known to cause full lake algal blooms on North Pond, it has also been present in the past on Great Pond and Long Pond, but not in quantities to produce scums this early in the year.

- The Lake Science team at 7 Lakes, assisted by 6 summer interns from Colby and many volunteers, will continue to carefully monitor the water quality on all 7 lakes through the summer months and into the late fall. We will report findings on the 7 Lakes website: www.7lakesalliance.org, social media and in Summertime in the Belgrades. Please stop into the 7 Lakes building to learn how you can do your part to create more resilient lakes in the face of more extreme weather. 7 Lakes board members and 7 Lakes staff will be at the Belgrade Lakes Farmer's market every Sunday to answer questions about our work to conserve the lakes and lands of the Belgrade Lakes watershed. We hope you will stop by to say hello, sign up for LakeSmart and learn about upcoming informative and fun educational programming and events.

— Take It Outside — School's Out. Families in the Woods

alumni everywhere. This is also true of former visitors to Bear Springs, Alden Camps, Whisperwood, Castle Island, Wheeler Camps, and other family camps in the watershed. Residents of Taconnet have been playing tennis with the same "kids" for decades. A recent UMO study estimates youth summer camps alone generate about \$323M direct and indirect economic benefits in Maine, annually.

I recently went to Mount Phillip and discovered five families from the Norridgewock 7th Day Adventist Church getting ready to start a group hike. The families were from Rome, Farmington, and Norridgewock. It's



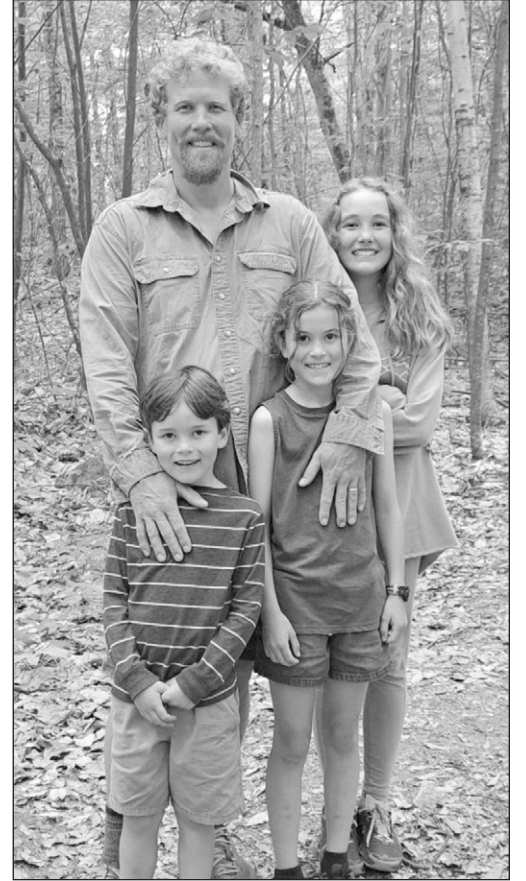

great to see so many families. "Taking it Outside." On one of the really hot days last week, I got out early on the 7 Lakes Mountain Trail and met Graham Love hiking with his young kids, Emma, Sam, and Molly. The Loves have a family camp on Mountain Drive and have been hiking that trail for years. The recent wet warm weather is turning everything in the woods green and I have been enjoying harvesting a lot of spring greens and the first flushes of yellow chanterelle mushrooms. While out gathering mushrooms one day last week, I encountered many non-human families out in the woods. In the span of an hour I encountered a doe and her fawn, a ruffed grouse that pretended she was wounded to draw me away from her chicks, a pair of wild turkey hens leading about a dozen poults, and a pair of Canadian geese with 8 goslings that were trying to stare me down, and threaten me with bodily harm if I took a few more steps their way.

The trout fishing has been good for the past month but is beginning to slow down as the water warms. Once the surface water temperature gets above 70, the trout will tend to stay below the surface mixed layer in the cooler water below the thermocline (currently about 20 feet

down). I have still been catching some nice rainbows trolling streamer flies or small spoons just off the bottom in areas 20 to 25 feet deep. The sunfish are still spawning in the shallows and provide a lot of action for youngsters just learning to fish! Check out the Hasenfus

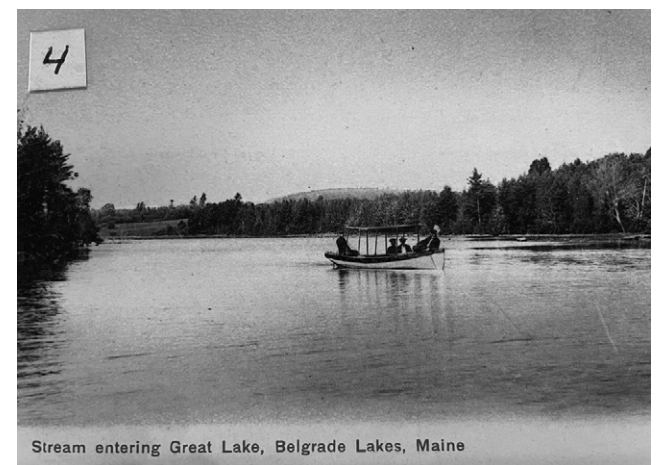

Card #3: View from inside narrows of Mill Stream, facing Westerly. The Pulsifer boathouse is center and the big white house and barn were Maggie and Deke Damren's which burned about 20 years ago. The LRC building now sits on that site. The small boathouse on the far right belongs to the Tripp family and is one of only a few that still exist today. The Pulsifer home is the tiny white peak in center peeking over the boathouse and is still lived in by Bill Pulsifer and his daughter Louise. The card was sent on November 12, 1907, addressed to Maude L. Watts in Rogue Bluffs, Maine. The stamp was 1 cent.



Card #4: View (I'm quite sure) is looking Northerly into Mill Stream, before any buildings were built. The hill in the background is likely Bogart's Mountain and the watercraft is an early launch. The card was sent to New Sharon, Maine on January 3, 1912, again, for 1 cent.

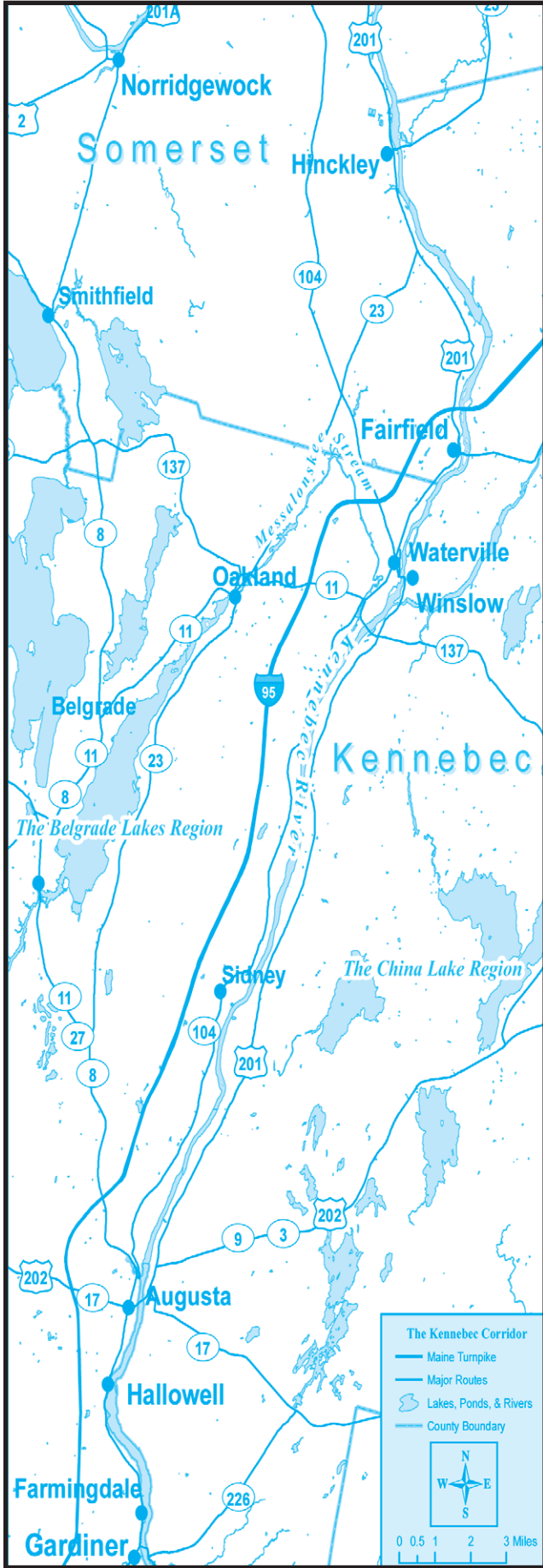

Augusta 4th Celebrations Offer Orchestra Option

A family-friendly party will take place at Mill Park. A parade will start at the State Capitol. Fireworks will be displayed over the Kennebec River. The Augusta Symphony Orchestra will hold its first Capital Fourth Celebration at the Augusta Civic Center. And the scenic, historic Kennebec River provides the setting.

The all-day 2024 Augusta 4th of July schedule will run from 8:45 am to 9:45 pm and is filled with activities, performances, music and food.

Starting after 8 am, the Downeast Brass is performing at Market Square. The parade, from the Capitol to Old Fort Western, begins at 10 am. The theme this year is "Hometown Heroes." At noon at Old Fort Western the Mayor of Augusta will read the Declaration of Independence. There will be other activities at Old Fort Western, including a Chicken BBQ hosted by the Calumet Club.

Following the parade a schedule of activities will be offered at Mill Park. Food trucks will be available from 1 to 9 pm, for children there will be a bounce house, a magician and a variety of games, and there will be musical performances until fireworks at 9 pm where the best viewing is from Mill Park.

.....From 3 to 5 pm everyone is invited to join the Augusta Symphony Orchestra for their first Maine Capital Fourth Event held at the Augusta Civic Center. There will be full concessions available with activities, an instrument petting zoo and small ensembles playing leading up to the concert. The concert will feature traditional holiday music, marches and pops medleys.

The 50-member Augusta Symphony Orchestra has existed in some form since 1920 and today serves as an educational and charitable organization to the surrounding area. Under Music Director and Conductor, Jinwook Park, the orchestra performs free, live classical music for the Augusta community four times a year.

At the Civic Center there is plenty of free parking, the building is air-conditioned and admission is free. The performance is rain or shine.

I've said it before but these loons are still driving me crazy! We figured with the early ice out that we would have an early "Chicks In" but such was and is not the case! As of this writing, Long Pond can lay claim to this year's first chick but that's it so far for

Long. The season's first Great Pond hatch was a 'double' and with another single hatch, Great Pond now has three chicks for a grand total of four between the two ponds.

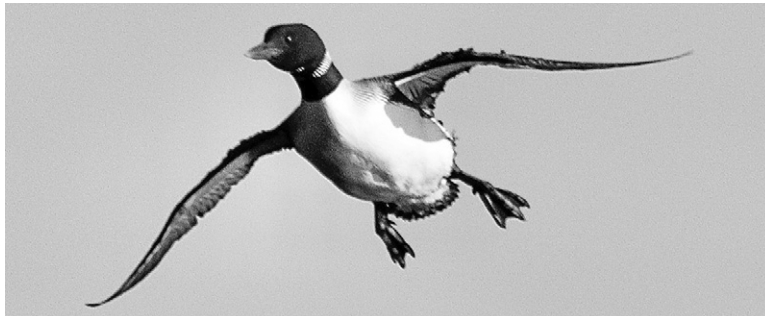
So, along with this great news, we also had our first of many abandoned eggs on Long Pond's Blueberry Island. Our pair nested with just the one egg but abandoned it two weeks later. Why? Our best guess is a result of territorial pressure from an intruder wanting to take over this prime loon real estate. This egg, like all abandoned eggs, will end up going down to BioDiversity Research Institute in Portland for heavy metals, etc. testing this fall. Until then, it goes into Sue's freezer!



Those of you that frequent the Great Pond Marina and Sadie's Restaurant are of course used to seeing loons in the Marina area and those with keen eyesight have even observed a loon nesting in the adjacent wetlands. But seeing multiple loons in that territory is actually a problem in the making. With an average five adult loons in that 'cove' this year, the mating pair has been distracted to say the least and have yet to nest. There's still time but the clock is running out! Our two Colby interns along with our other valued volunteers visit that territory, as they do the other twenty-six or so loon territories on Great and Long Ponds, every two or three days so we are keeping our fingers crossed for things to settle down and let the band-ed pair get back to business.

As of this writing, both Great and Long Ponds each have seven nests in progress which isn't bad but it's not great either. That's only fourteen nests out of a potential twenty-six. Of course, we are shooting for the moon and would love to see twenty-six nests but of course, that's not reality. We only had nine chicks between the two lakes last year with

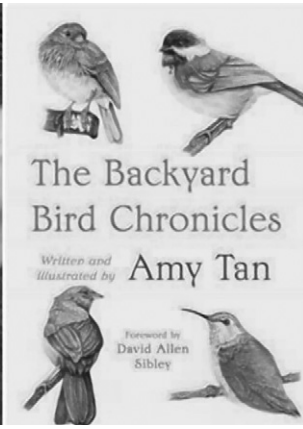
This winter I discovered many backyard Maine birds in Menlo Park, CA where Amy Tan resides in the nearby San Francisco Bay Area. Her Joy Luck Club was a popular first novel with many beach goers on Little Lake Sebago way back in 1989.

It is a wonder that Tan took up serious drawing lessons in her 60s and published this bird book of her beautiful drawings with handwritten stories, too. Yes, she imagines what her backyard birds are doing and thinking and even noticing her through the glass windows.

Just check out the thrushes, which I hear in the deep Maine woods singing their song and the vireo's cylindrical harmonized song. Maybe we do not catch sight of these tiny songbirds, but Mainers certainly hear them. Up by the Girls Camp Runioa horse field in the woods or on Point Road early in the day or late as the sun sets.

Hummingbirds bob around fast from flower to flower in California and Maine. Sometimes I only hear their buzzing tiny wings and maybe see their shadow as they dart from bloom to bloom quickly and are gone.

Crows, jays, and ravens; pigeons, doves and the mourning dove softly cooing can be heard; goldfinch, nuthatches climbing up and down tall pines; sparrows, junks, warblers and woodpeckers! Oh my, on and on! Hope your metal gutters do not have that noisy woodpecker awakening you too early in the day...



Vultures, hawks and owls, yes, but I could not find our Great Pond Bald Eagles in Amy's beautiful bird observations. Ospreys also entertain us when we canoe too close to their nests and both mom and pop osprey surely let you know. Their swooping warnings are dramatic... Maybe Amy's home is too far from the bay to have what we have everyday on Great Pond and the winding chain of the Belgrade Lakes.

Enjoy this treat of an artistic bird book, but more importantly enjoy our outdoor bird sanctuary right here. Get out your binoculars and then hop in a boat for more bird ventures. I was so very amazed to

see how osprey fought the bigger bird in the sky for its catch from the lake near Oak Island. Those osprey are certainly doting parents for their little ones, stealing a catch from a bigger bird's claws.

Even out on an island, you can hear the osprey protecting their young from boaters too close for comfort. Loons too are Maine's special birds. How could I forget them?

Amy Tan is invited to travel to Maine for more bird studies and to the coast for Puffins. Bet she would love it. And many readers in Maine have enjoyed her novels since 1989. The Bonesetter's Daughter and other award winning works. Her mother's immigrant story is heartbreaking and Amy's newly found half sisters in China makes one think.

The Dams Keeper Report

Your thirteen volunteers on the Inter-local Belgrade Area Dams Committee have been vigilant in keeping the ponds around three inches above full pond (ie. the water going over the spillways/walkways is ankle deep), because we still don't know if we are going to have some level of drought this summer so we are taking the conservative approach. For the past 10 days we had 1.07" of precipitation and Weather Underground is forecasting another 2.11 for the next 10 days so all looks good and very normal so far. July's normal for this region is 3.43", 3.25" for August, 3.60" for

These afternoon showers are just what is needed for our farmers, gardens, wells as well as our lake levels so I guess we really shouldn't complain about a shower here or there!

September and so forth.

With this past week's heat, both Great and Long Ponds lost about 3/10" per day and in doing some research, these are actually normal evaporation rates. An interesting article by C.E. Grunsky entitled "Evaporation from lakes and reservoirs" going back to September 1931 suggests that the evaporation rate with an ambient outside temperature of 85F is approximately 3/10" per day. And if that wasn't enough, about 80% of our camps still use lake water and in addition to the slight seepage from our dams you can see why we are trying to keep the lakes at 3" above full for a little wiggle room!

As of this writing, Great Pond's Village dam is currently 3.24" above full pond with both gates completely closed. Long Pond's Wings Mill dam is right at 3.0", also above full pond with both gates also closed. Salmon/McGrath is 2.28" above full with its single gate also closed but with its calibrated valve set to the mandated 1 cfs. flow. Our neighbors on Messalonskee are down 4.8" below full due to Oakland's electricity genera-
