The request of my Husband C. P. Piper
I write you to let you know he is sick
at New York in the Hospital. He would
like to come home on a Boat or
get his discharge, as the Dr says he will
not be fit for duty this summer
He has a very lame hand he was out
on packett and was wounded in
his right hand breaking the bone of the
third finger the charge of the rifle pass^{ed}
through the palm of his hand,
causing a very painful wound. His
side is also very lame he larned his
side at the Battle of Bulls Run
it has troubled him almost ever

since. We feel very anxious about
him and want him to come home
if possible. Now Sir if you will be so
kind as to intercede in his behalf
and have him sent home, you
will oblige us greatly.
