

At a recent meeting of the St. John Lumber Exchange, a committee appointed to inquire into the charges against the recently deceased lumberman, reported that in their opinion it was due in a great measure to financial difficulties in the United States, which prostrated building operations and consequently reduced the demand for lumber, that the committee suggested a curtailment in operations. The overstocked market was relieved of its surplus, and the committee suggested that one measure to stop the cutting of under-sized lumber, which is fast exhausting New Brunswick's supply, was to increase the exorbitant charges made on vessels at St. John's wharves. The committee was engaged in the lumber trade, by which lumber was shipped to the West, and been directed to Bangor and other places.

When the Tammany ring was broken, the men who composed it gradually subsided from view, and were lost sight of. But here is an instance of one of them clothed with important patronage in connection with the prisons and penitentiaries and deriving a lucrative compensation therefrom directly, with opportunities to employ the means familiar to him through his former political education and experience in promoting the pecuniary successes of himself and his friends. When such revelations are made, a portion of our people exclaim what is the use of struggling for reform? and the rest, what a meddling old fossil we have got for a Mayor to trouble us. Some sneer at him, with contemptuous smiles.
