cial exemption upon the **taxpayers**. Such a person is defined by Treasury regulations as a person who actually supports and maintains in a household one or more individuals who are closely connected with him by blood relationship, relationship by marriage or by adoption, and whose right to exercise family control and provide for these dependent individuals is based upon some moral or legal obligation.¹ Such persons are allowed an exemption of \$2,000 granted a married person. In addition, they are allowed a credit of \$200 for each dependent under 18 years of age or incapable of self support because of physical or mental defect.

Husband and Wife

married person living with a dependent wife or child can add the \$200 exemption to the basic amount. Thus, if a man has a wife and two dependent children, he can deduct the marital status, and the support of others, for a total of \$1,000. The marital status credit, however, does not apply to the husband of a non-taxpayer. For example, a married man supports a father who is capable of self-support, he is entitled to the \$200 credit for each son. If through force of circumstance he supports his wife away from home he is entitled to the \$200 exemption, allowed a married man.

person involved a married person, not to a \$200 credit for a dependent person who has left home but who is his mother more than one-half year required for her support is added to the \$200 credit against

mother can not claim such support herself. Otherwise, the amount must be considered as a gift, and, therefore, the gift tax is not allowed. A son living at home and supporting his father, mother, or other relative may claim a \$200 exemption allowed the head of a family, but not the \$200 credit for such relative is under 18 years of age.

Newspaper advertising tells the story of what individual merchants have been able to accomplish for their customers. Those that have found something of unusual value, are commonly disposed to tell the public about it. If they don't, they get no credit for the bargain they give, and would not sell it much faster than stores that offered it for a high price. A great deal of money can be saved by those who take pains to read carefully the offerings made in newspaper advertising.
