Moses A. Dow, Fourth Maine Volunteers a deserter board schooner Charlotte, Capt. George Washell sailed from Harrison Landing for Portland twenty first (21) inst. Please arrest & return him. — E. Walker"

pass for some other person there
might be some clue to him
