

Gramingham March 30th 1862

Mr Washburn

Sir

I address you for information My Husband enlisted in the 1st Maine Cavalry in Company E I was at his Father's in Livermore when he enlisted but was not very well and not as contented as I should be at My own Father's came home on a visit but my health has been such that it is not thought proper for me to return at present unless by your advice My Husband said he thought in order to draw my allowance from the state I should have to return if my health would admit of it many have told me by being there when he enlisted and my things being still

there and I only being at home on a short
stay could draw my weekly allowance the same
here as there I wish you to inform me and
inform me right please tell me if to draw it
I come to return to Livermore and the amount
I draw than I shall know I have it correct
I would like to know as soon as conveniently
for you I am entirely out of money by my
husbands not being paid off before leaving
Augusta and not being able to work much
on account of my health would like to have
it if I came there it if I can draw without
coming down at present it will be better for
me if not please tell me and I will try to
do as your orders say please direct to
