

Ravenswood April 1st 1862

Dear Sir

By request of Col. S. H. Allen
I write to inform you that as his recovery
was not as speedy as he desired at the
Astor House, he thought it advisable at my
request - to come out to my house in the
country where he could be more quiet
and receive better attention.

He is confined to his
bed and is unable to sit up but is
better this morning than he has been for the
past few days, and I have no doubt that
he will be able to join his reg in a week
or ten days, at longest.

He requested me
to say, that as soon as he was able he
would write you.

Should any change occur or if he
should not continue to improve I will
write you immediately.
