Aug 8 1861

My Dear Sir:

Your telegram came to me this day & I immediately ordered two hundred & ten guns made ready for the boxes which should be furnished by the Arsenal Dept or. Some few small bills will be incurred which I shall charge the State.

We are moving on finely and in a short time shall have a full Regiment. We need a speedy supply of clothing & all other equipments. The officers of the regiment are calling for their side-arms.

The tenth will not be sufficient for a company of one hundred men and I would earnestly recommend that the ten tenth which have just been completed for the company officers & which are purchased like the company tents be taken for the

companies & the other tents with walls of the depth of one yard be made for the commissaries.

This is all we shall ask in the shape of tents and this we must have & with the least delay. We have a good quarter Master and he will ~~not~~ save the State much money. Dr. White has given us much aid in arranging for clothing.

Shall we not have our uniforms & equipments very soon - the wants of the Regt. require them immediate.

Three or four companies are must full. I mean they number nearly one hundred men.
