Main Vols., wounded severely in the face - it must be some five or six months before he will be able to do duty. He has a family and is very desirous to get home with his family & remain at home till in a condition to serve his country again - he has performed his duty like a faithful soldier up to the time of this misfortune & deserves every favor consistent with military regulations that government can grant. My object in addressing you is to request you to assist him, if in your power, to obtain a furlough. Anything you can do for him will be gratefully acknowledged by him and
