The 1st Maine has lost in numbers largely but the remaining
members are still strong, in the fights they do wonder in
Marches they cannot be beaten, we have the largest Regt
and fewest stragglers at every stopping place, and the
1st Maine cannot be packed down in a fair chance

We have lost some of our best men say Capt's
Parker & Putnagall, and Lieuts. Main Knowles & Wickings
and lots of us Bram soldiers as ever left Maine Train
in a hurry and cannot write now

My regards to Gov. Coney say to him I wish he could
see my Regt now, he would not see so many white
horses as when he knowed it but a full full column
now would show him that the Boys meant what they
say, when they say they want to go to the front
We are now on the same ground where the 2nd Maine was
two years ago.

The Full Officers are all well, and the men
generally are well, the men are suffering now from
Dysentery, but none very sick.

We are getting along well Considering the long
Marches we have Made and out of Digging down
I shall write again in a few Days in regard to
C.R.
