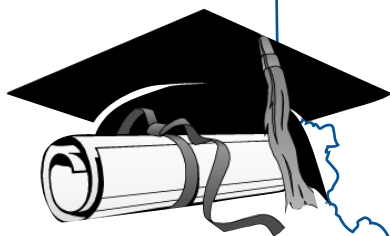

A note about the information

This brochure focuses on jobs in Maine for which college level training is available. Occupations are ranked in terms of annual job openings, new jobs, and percentage growth. The **Job Openings Each Year** table shows that even occupations projected to decline will need workers to fill job openings created by those who retire or leave. The **New Jobs** table reflects new jobs expected between 2004-2014. The **Fastest Growing Jobs** table reflects growth as a percentage, which may be high even though the actual number of new jobs may be small.

The educational institutions included in this brochure are degree-granting institutions which have been approved by the Maine State Approving Agency for Veterans Education Programs (www.msaa.maine.edu) for at least one program. These schools are suggested starting points, but are not the only opportunities available. Related educational programs offered by other schools may also qualify someone for entry into a selected occupation. Prospective students should speak with a counselor for assistance in choosing an educational program to meet their needs.

Some schools offer classes at multiple locations, such as the Biddeford campus of the University of New England or the Caribou campus of Husson College. Selected classes are also broadcast through interactive television and the University of Maine's Education Network.
