The Regt has received marked at-
tention in the late reviews - & I think
that the acconisments bestowed upon it,
are as merited as they are well
timed -

I recollect your words of encourage-
ment, in one of your letters to me -
& I do not know but the time has
come "to cheer the Fifth to the echo!"

We want more men - & I think that
Col. Heath will succeed in his efforts -
I am trying to pull some strings
in this neighborhood, though I have
no recruiting papers. Last Sabbath,
after public service, I requested the

audience to remain - & in bearing
greetings from Co. A - originally
formed from young men, in this
place; I took the liberty to command
