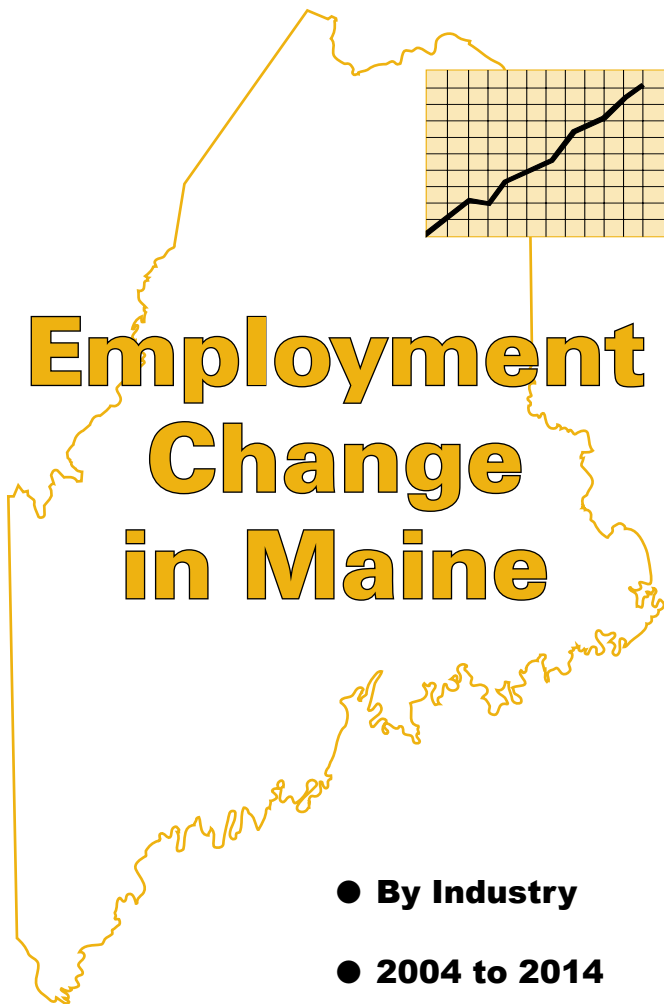

In the table *Employment by Industry in Maine*, the industries have been combined at the NAICS sector level and are shown in a hierarchy. For example, Manufacturing is a combination of two subgroups, Durable and Nondurable Goods.

A note about the information

The **Projected Industry Employment Change in Maine** table features **Projected Employment** for all industries in Maine based upon the 2004-2014 Industry Employment Projections. These industries are sorted by **Employment Change (Net)** and range from those projected to grow the most to those projected to decline the most between 2004 and 2014.

An industry can be described as a group of establishments that produce similar products or provide similar services. For example, all establishments that manufacture automobiles are in the same industry. A given industry, or even a particular establishment within that industry, might have employees in dozens of occupations.

The data contained in these tables is reported by industries defined in the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS), adopted by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in 2002.
