DEWEY'S VICTORY.

ONE OF THE MOST REMARKABLE NAVAL BATTLES ON RECORD.
FLEET AND DESTROYED WITHOUT THE LOSS OF AN AMERICAN LIFE, AND NO SERIOUS INJURY TO THE FLEET.

The wires a week ago were hot with the reports from the sources of the battle of Manila, making it certain that Commodore Dewey had practically annihilated the Spanish fleet. Details were lacking, however, as to the American loss, and then the cable was cut, and news ceased entirely.

All the week of waiting, the people waited, and finally the long expected dispatches from Dewey came—brief but eloquent. The first, dated May 1, reads as follows:
