1862-11-26 H.H. Sherman requests payment for son Frederic

East Troy Nov. 26. 1862

Dear Sir,

My Son, Frederic
M. Sherman of Company No. 4th
Maine Vol. was, on the 19th inst.
discharged on account of disability,
caused by sickness and wounds
from which he has been suffering
about seven months. He has been
in the Mil. Hospital at Davids Is-
land New York, since July 8, at which
place he so far recovered his health as
to be able to come home last week,
in company with myself. His pay
is in arrears since Feb. 28. There be-
ing no money in the hands of the pay-
masters either at New York or Boston.
I got his transportation from New York
to Boston, but failed to get it from
Boston on account of the pay-mas-
over

-ter's being out of his office when I called, so I paid his passage from Boston home.

I wish to know what my son is entitled to on account of transportation from Boston to Belfast the place of his enlistment, and what he is allowed for subsistence from New York home.

And also what method shall I take to collect his pay.
