

Lexington Feb 7. 1862

Gov. Sevier Washburn Jr

D. Sir,

When at
Augusta 14th ult I understood
you to say that you
would immediately write
Col Jackson, and, if he
had not completed ar-
rangements, would have
the Capt of Company B
appointed at once recom-
-mending the appointment
of Sicut Silsbury. Have
you heard from Col J.
and will the appointment
be made soon? Only anx-
-iety that justice should

be done, and interest in
my brother, leads me to
write you again on
this subject. The Friends
of the Officers of Compa-
ny B, think that your
Excellency has deferred
long enough to Col Jackson,
and are anxious that you
should settle this matter
immediately. My brother
says he has been waiting
patiently 2 weeks to have
a talk with Col J - but
his sickness at Washing-
ton has prevented it.
