

Mitchells Station Va.

May 1<sup>st</sup> 1864

Gen. Hoadson

Your favor requesting my Photograph is received, and I find myself in possession of one which I forward you, I cannot very well give such a military history of my bravery as many, but will submit a few facts in regard to what I have seen of service, and should you see fit to have it or any part of it recorded on the Photograph you will please do so.—

I entered the service in Sept 1861 in the 9<sup>th</sup> Me. a Private, went with Sherman's Expedition to South Carolina, and was at the taking of Fort Walker, Hilton Head Island, and from thence I went in the next expedition to Florida where we

took Fernandina — returned on furlough to Maine — was ordered on recruiting service by Gov. Washburn, and promoted by him to Captain Co. C. 16<sup>th</sup> Regt Me. Vol., Aug. /62, and marched from Allington heights Sept. 7<sup>th</sup>/62, and have been in the field ever since — was engaged in battle of Fredericksburg Dec. 13<sup>th</sup>/62 where I was slightly wounded, and lost in killed and wounded 33 men from my Co. — was in Fredericksburg the 2<sup>d</sup> — Chancellorsville and Gettysburg Pa. where I had the command of the Regt during the engagement, excepting a few hours of the first part of the battle — lost every man of my men of my Co. that was engaged the first day and was the only Captain left in the Regt. of that dread battle, — was also

in the battle of Mine Run Va.
