

Brunswick June 16th 1862

Dear Sir:

Mr Horace Dunning of this town has a son in Co D-5 Me Regt whose name is Orlando and who says there is about one months pay due him from the State. He was in service about a month before leaving Portland for Washington, and when he left he received only his bounty. He has written from Shipping Point to his father to get it if possible, and use it. His father is poor and needs it, if he can get it by any process not too lengthy he would like to.

Will you if not too much trouble ^{inform me} whether he is entitled to it and how much, he is entitled to. I presume the rolls will tell. Genl Thompson told me that he obtained some back pay of this kind and I think said you furnished him with the necessary papers or blanks for the purpose. I shall be greatly obliged to you for any information in regard to the matter.
