Hon, Gov, Washburn, Dear Sir

He was the 2<sup>d</sup> man to enlist in its defence in the first company that went from Skowhegan and has been in the service 15 months has acted well his part in distinguished battles, and is a Corporal, in Co H, 3<sup>d</sup> Reg Me Volunteers. He has been a scholar of mine in several schools. I received a letter yesterday from him, desiring me to recommend him to you for a lieutenancy in some one of the Cos, of Vols about leaving Maine. Now if you can assist one

desiring to serve his country in a higher way than he is now doing. I think you can find but few more meritorious than Mr Emerson. He said it was not for honor or vain glory he asks for it but out of a pure patriotic motive. I would ask you to read his letters that appear in the Republican Clarion printed at Phenix City for the last few months. He is not a relative of mine, that I should feel such an interest for him, but a scholar. He is fearless yet kind, firm yet unassuming and always secures the good will of all with whom he mingles. If you want reference please to inquire of the Capt of Co. C. 3 Reg. of N. Y. Vol. in Kearneys Division and direct Washington D.C. I do really hope that if a 1<sup>st</sup> or 2<sup>d</sup> Lieut. is wanted in any of the Companies you will be induced to commission this patriot who never complains of hardship, that he may distinguish himself, as he aspires to do.

I have seen a number of soldiers and Lieut Savage who returned from that Co. who say that Emerson would handle a Reg. and drill them to pleasure. He wrote to me he said because he thought that I would prevail.

Please answer me and name what favors you can confer upon him and I will remain Yours &c.
