

Buxton Centre June 21. 1862.

My Dear Sir: There is in this town a mili-
-tary Coy. commanded by Col. John D. Hill.
It has been at work for more than
a year. Col. Hill had a matter of
Six Co's at Balaklava last Oct. No men-
-tion was made of it in your valuable
report of last winter. Gen. Vreue omitted
to state the fact to you. Gen. V. was not
informed of it. Now you may recollect
that I asked of you the use of some
muskets for this Co. some time last Fall.

By some slip they did not get there at
Limerick which you partly furnished
them. It was by no fault of yours -
This Co. has done done much good
in the cause. Many have gone from
it to the war. They now wish me to beg
of you the use of some very numbers
if it possible for you to do so. I hope
you may be able to accommodate the
men. Please answer this at your earliest
convenience.
