March 11th 1863.

Dear General

I should be much pleased to receive from you a copy of your forthcoming report. It will be very interesting. Therefore if you send me one as soon after it is in print as you can, without obliging those men entitled to the same - I shall indeed feel much obliged -

I have no news to write. We are here ready for the work, only waiting for dry weather to mend the roads. The Army is in fine condition & spirits, all believe that we will be highly successful in forthcoming campaign. I had hoped you would have been able to have visited us this winter or spring before the move commenced. Will you do so? I would indeed be a pleasure to me to do the again in a few days, will you then - for accept the invitation?

Has my wife passed the Council's orders? If not I would feel it a favour to have it put through - I have a fine command &
