his son, James Kelley, who enlisted
about eight weeks ago as a Substitute
in Brock's Co. but was transferred
to Co. B. 16th Reg.^t now on the
left wing near Weldon Rail Road.
He made an Order for his father
to get the money, which order was
handed to Mr. Arnold, now in the
Provost Marshal's Office who says
he sent it to Augusta, but Mr. Kelley
says he has never rec^d. the money, & I
saw a letter from his son above named
who says he did not get it, & could not

have rec'd it, having given his father
the order for it.

Can you inform me in relation
to this matter and if the order is
in your possession, and what is
necessary for Mr. Kelley to do
to collect the money.
