To the Govrⁿ of the State of Maine

Dear Sir

I came out in
the 2nd Regt. Maine Vols. Col
G Barney and about four
months before the expira-
tion of the Regt's time I was
Court Martialed for a slight
breach of Military Discipline
and sentenced for the re-
mainder of my term of
Enlistment. My Regt
was mustered out of the
U. S. Service on the 28th
of last May. and a cor-

ding to my sentence I should have been released on that day; but owing to the absence of any "Descriptive List," the Commanding Officer at this Post refused to release me - until the arrival of my Papers particularly the one just mention'd I have written to the Capt of my Company but have not as yet received an answer whether ~~it has~~ ^{it} ~~not~~ arrived. Whether he has never received it or has neglected it when received

I know not. Plenty of time has elapsed since I wrote to him for him to forward my Descriptive List but it is not forthcoming; and I now appeal to you as the Governor of the State in which I enlisted to do something for me, all that the Commander of the Post

P. Vols / asks; is my Descriptive
List. or. of few lines from
some person in authority. and
then he will release me. A
few lines from Yourself
would be effective in setting
me free, and I would ask
you to do me the great favor
to send me at least a few lines
and enclose a note to Lieut Col.
Alexander to the effect that
my Regt has returned. and
that my term of enlistment
has expired. That would be
effectual, and render ^{me} indeed
and truly
