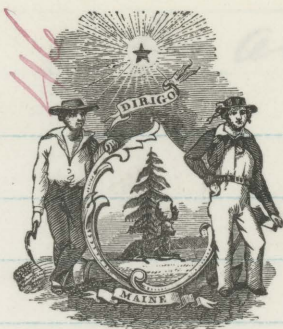

Dear Sir,

Arthur F. Howard, of Co. C. 1st Regt. Artly aged 19, paroled from Annapolis, while coming from Bangor to Annapolis for transportation to Annapolis was arrested as a Deserter, I am satisfied he did not intend to avoid duty & hope you may see fit to release him & send him forward.
