* * * * *

31. The sentence of the General Court Martial, "To be dishonorably discharged the military service of the United States, with loss of all pay and allowances now due, or that may become due, and be confined at hard labor at such place as the Secretary of War may direct, for the period of ten years," as promulgated in General Orders, No. 69, Headquarters, Military Governor, Alexandria, Virginia, of January 25th, 1865, in the case of Private *John F. Stinson*, Company "L," 1st Maine Heavy Artillery, is approved, and the Penitentiary at Albany, New York, is designated as the place of confinement, to which place the prisoner will be sent under proper guard, without delay.

The Quartermaster's Department will furnish the necessary transportation.
