13. The unexpired portion of the sentence of the General Court Martial, convened by General Orders, No. 25, Headquarters, 1st Division, 5th Corps, of May 13th, 1863, in the case of Private *Henry H. Moore*, 2d Maine Volunteers, now in confinement at Fort Delaware, Delaware, is hereby remitted.

He will be released from confinement, and returned to duty with the 20th Maine Volunteers, to which he was duly assigned.

The Quartermaster's Department will furnish the necessary transportation.
