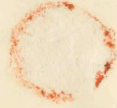

Dear Sir

Having been appointed Agent to expend four thousand dollars on the road across the Indian Township in the year 1839 and to expend the same amount this year, and having expended the former sum and have not received any portion of it yet. therefore I do not feel able to go on and expend the amount to be expended this year until I receive two thousand dollars of it which will be necessary to furnish supplies and pay the men along as they may want it, and it now time to commence work on said Road and unless it can be expended on or before the first of August it will be almost useless to expend it this year and some parts of the road is very much out of repair now. If the money can be furnished now it would be most convenient to have a check on either of the Calais Banks or the Eastport Bank

The Secretary of State is requested to lay this before the Governor and Council
