General

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of
descriptive Roll of Company "H" - There seems to have been some
misunderstanding. - What I wished was a descriptive Roll of
the Company commanded by Captain G. J. Burns originally mustered
into Service June 15, 1861, as Co. "H", and which was subsequently
disbanded and its members transferred to the 38th New York Vols.
and to other Companies in this Regiment.

At the expiration of the term of Service of the 38th New York,
which was a two years Regt. those men still remaining were
re-transferred to this Regt. but with no descriptive lists and there
are no records here to make them up from. - A copy of the Roll of
that Co'y would be of great assistance. - I have, under the provision
of General Order No. 359, War Dept. A. G. O., been appointed a Recruiting
Officer to re-enlist Veteran Volunteers in the Regiment. Will you inform
me concerning the State Bounties - their amount, - how they will be
paid to those re-enlisting here and in what manner those so enlisting
could be credited to different parts of the State, - to what time the bounty
will be paid and any thing else on the subject which will assist me.
