Fri 5th Regt of Maine Nots, Enrolled on the 24th June 1861. to serve three years is now in confiniment at Augusta as a deserter as I am informed, The faits are these so far as they have come to my knowledge, Chas Pettis was descharged on the 20th Febry 186 2 as will appear by the copy herewith sent for mason of eles whilety, he having lost two of this fingers of his left hand in the him of his duty In March 1862, Pettis made an application for an Invalid Sension but his papers were delayed wasting for a certificate of the commanding officer of his company as to the native of his disability. In the mean time Pettis not bung able to get any work offered himself as a recruit and was allowed by the recructing officer to sign his Roll, He then informed me that I had better file his dularation, I did so, Pettis after wards

came to me for his discharge saying that the loot of the Regt wished to know whether the words No objection te' wow crused, I informed him those words were eresed, He then back the discharge would be of no use to him and left without has dis charge, I forwarded his declaration, bertificate of discharge, Surgeons certificate and that of It Nathan Walker who commended there when Pettis was injured, to the Common of Perisions Dec 12th 1862, It strikes me that the poor follow presents a strong 'case for release and, if the above statements comprise all that Fatter has done, and nothing more has come to my knowledge ) he is injustly detained, He and his family are poor and one of his sisters has just heard of the death of her son who was mortally wound ed at the battle of Fridericksburg, Her is needed at home, Very Respectfully Freeman Bradford unan Brant
