Long ago, in the chivalric days of bow and spear, my second flew through my first. But in these days of modern apartment houses my first is supposed to flow through my second.

It is a delicious and extremely useful desert that is appropriate for a violet tea or luncheon in violet mousses. The base is half a box of gelatin soaked for half an hour in a cupful of cold water. When ready flavor the gelatin with two teaspoonfuls of extract of violet and one of vanilla, coloring it with a little vegetable violet color that is quite harmless. Have ready a quart of cream whipped stiff with a cupful of powdered sugar has been added, and mix the gelatin with the cream and pour it into a mould, pack in salt and ice and freeze for two or three hours. When ready to serve this should be put in a glass dish and garnished with a few candied violets, and teaspoonfuls of stiffly whipped cream arranged about the base of the mould.

Pieces of cold meat of the white variety—chicken, veal, or even lamb—can be made into a most appealing dish that has no flavor or appearance of being stewed. Cut the meat into dice or strips and mix it with a good white sauce that has been made by rubbing together a teaspoonful of butter and an even kitchen tablespoonful of flour, a large cupful of milk stirred into this hot paste. If a few chopped mushrooms are added, so much the better. Mix the sauce and meat and serve on a platter, a little chopped parsley sprinkled over the top and slices of hard-boiled eggs alternating around the edge of the dish with oblong wafers of toast. Dark meat may be served in the same way, except that the sauce is browned. It is in the proper preparation of these simple dishes and their dainty serving with garnish that they are made appetizing, and are taken out of the unpalatable list of leftovers.

Try serving the Sunday morning coldish balls with a horseshall sauce, made as follows: Cook fifteen minutes in a double-boiler three-fourths of a cup of fine bread crumbs, half a cup of fresh breadcrumbs grated, and one pint of milk, add one large tablespoonful of butter, and season with salt and pepper.

A sandwich which is quite seasonal and appetizing, while perhaps not entirely new, is worth recalling to mind in these spring days when appetites need urging. Chop English walnuts fine, mix with cream cheese and a little chopped celery or watercress, finishing with a little mayonnaise. Spread the mixture on thin slices of not very fresh bread, or on this thin bread, and cut into sprigs of crisp fresh watercress all around them on the plate.—Harper's Bazar.

**TEETHING.**  
This is a time usually much dreaded by mothers, and the period of dentition is really the time of the greatest moral injury among children.

At the period of teething important changes are taking place in the body, the stomach and digestive organs are especially, and these exercise their share in producing constitutional disturbances.

As a rule a baby begins to cut its teeth at seven months, but children vary in this as in all other functions of the body, so that the age varies in the watch carefully for the first symptoms.

At the very commencement there is an increased amount of saliva, which keeps the mouth moist and cool; and here we give a useful hint.

Cut out in good stout flannel a bit of the ordinary shape, but half an inch longer, so that it may be covered by the more ornamental outer one. Then cut out a piece of silk the same size as the flannel, and bind the edges with narrow white ribbon, and the round the baby's neck with the flannel neck of the baby. By this means all risk of cold is avoided.

Later on, the mouth becomes hot and dry, and other derangements are likely to follow. The child becomes fretful and feverish, and the eruption of the teeth causes; the latter if not severe is beneficial, but if protracted may become a source of danger. Either one or both cheeks become red and swollen, sometimes appears. Thirst and loss of appetite are also evidences of painful dentition, and the child sleeps badly, frequently moans in its sleep.

The child should be especially guarded against exposure to damp or cold air, digestion, or any other disturbance of the system which by lowering the general health, lowers the child's resisting power, and may convert a course of teething into one of pain and danger.

As a rule, the irritation increases with the number of teeth being cut simultaneously, but a single tooth in one case may cause more disturbance than a half dozen in another.

The first, or temporary set of teeth, is usually cut in pairs:  
1. The lower front incisors.  
2. The upper front incisors.  
3. The two upper lateral incisors.  
4. The two lower lateral incisors, though occasionally a double tooth is cut before them.

5. The first grinders in the lower jaw.  
6. The first grinders in the upper jaw.  
7. The lower pointed eye teeth.  
8. The second lower grinders.  
9. The second upper grinders.

These last seldom appear before a child is two years old. From the time the first tooth is cut two years generally elapse before the first set of teeth is complete. There are twenty teeth in the first set; at two years old a child usually has sixteen.

It is a bad plan to give a child coral or ivory to bite when teething, as it hardens the gums and causes the teeth to come through with greater difficulty. Rubbing the gums with a soft cloth, or as they are yielding and increase the flow of saliva, which relieves the inflammation.—McCall's Magazine.
