Genl.:

The subjoined is a list of members of this Regt who have re-enlisted up to this time as Veteran Volunteers. I expect as many more but cannot obtain their names till tomorrow as they are on "picket". Will forward full list as soon as possible. The men are anxious that returns be made to you in time to secure the State and Town bounties. Being appointed Recruiting officer but yesterday it will be impossible for me to make official returns in full in season to reach you before the 5th of Jan. I send you no names except of those who have subscribed the enlisting papers and may be relied upon. If the men were sure of getting the Furlough directly and of being in season for all the bounties many more would re-enlist.

It is much to be regretted that an opportunity had not been granted them at ~~the~~ an earlier date.

I hope this notification will be sufficient to insure these men a place in the quotas of some town

It is not their fault, that notice of their re-enlistment has not reached you on this.

You may observe that some of the names in the accompanying list are there scarcely promoted to Lieutenants - But none of them could be mustered owing to deficiency in their companies -
