Camp Near Rappahannock Station Aprt 16th 1864

Agt General Hodsdon

Dear Sir

I am in trouble in regard to my family and I thought I would pen a few lines to you to see if you could not help me out of it and I think you can and I feel confident that you will when you hear the particulars about the case I enlisted in the Town of Rumford July the 29th 1662 for three years and with the expectation that my family would get state aid my wife belonged in the Town of Abington and ~~sister~~ she had no relatives in Maine and ~~she~~ could not find Contented to stay down there after I came away so she went to her Father's in Mass his folks as poor as she hast to pay

his board and the little Girls we have one
child and his health is very poor and it
will take more then my wages to board them
and cloth them decent and I am upon man
with nothing of envy amount I have in maine
property what the is whole amount to \$70.00
\$70 dollars and that I cant sell for \$18.00
dollars down there and if I had that
amount now I would not ask a cent of
state aid but fear I am out here a
fighting for my Country and it seems
hard to have my family suffer and I
cant get to them and I should rather die
then to have my family go over the Town
for I love a good woman and she does
all the work she is able to do Mr Walker
the first select man of the Town of Rumford
has sent his one years pay and she has
written to him for more and he dont
seem to send it to her she being to Mass
make a difference but women go from Mass
down to maine and stay all of the time
and they have their money sent to them every

monthly I now of several cases and he has
already sent his one & years pay and
I would not ask for money more if I could
get along with out it but they will have
to have help from the state or towns and
I would rather die than to come to that
and I have told you just how it is
and will ^{you} please to see if you can't help
them some way I send all the money I
get to them and if you will please to see
about it and think you will I shall feel
much better to know that my family
are comfortably provided for with what
I can send them I will now close trusting
that you will help them and Oblige
