STATE OF MAINE
PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR

WHEREAS, it appears desirable that the Legislature of this State should meet in special session to consider matters pertaining to soldier-voting in the 1944 elections,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, SUMNER SEWALL, by virtue of the power vested in me as Governor, convene the Legislature of this State, hereby requiring the Senators and Representatives to assemble in their respective chambers at the Capitol, at Augusta, on Monday, the seventeenth day of April 1944, at 4:30 o'clock in the afternoon, in order to receive such communication as may then be made to them and to consider and determine on such measures as in their judgment will best promote the welfare of the State.



Given at the office of the Governor at Augusta and sealed with the Great Seal of the State of Maine, this thirty-first day of March, in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty-Four, and of the Independence of the United States of America, the One Hundred and Sixty-eighth.
