Treasurer Joseph C. Boyd's Representation on Loans

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Treasury Office October 13. 1821

To the Governor

and the Honourable the Council,

The Treasurer respectfully

represents,

That there is now due on the Loan of 28 June 1820 of \$11,000

One Quarter's Interest to 28 Sep 1821 \$105. +

That there is due on the Loan to Judge Parris (as
assumed by the Treasurer) from Gardner Bank

of \$1000 One Yr + One Cr's Interest @ 6% 75. +
(from 25 December 1819 to 28 March 1821)

That there is now due the Waterville College 500. +

That there is now due the Bowdoin College 1500. +

For which several sums Warrants are respectfully requested.

The Treasurer further represents, that there is in the
cellars of the Court & State Houses, Fuel, the property of the State
about Eleven cords of wood: nine Cords of which are in the
cellar of the State House, and will, probably, be consumed by the
Offices, prior to the meeting of the Legislature.
