In Council June 23^d 1840

The standing Committee on Military affairs to which was refer^d the Petition of Horatio N Palmer and others for disbanding ~~the~~ Company of Light Infantry in the 1st Regt. 2^d Brig. 3^d Div. in the Town of Belfast, having examined the same ^{Report} that the petition is approved of by the officers of said Company and the Col of ~~Said~~ Regt. to which it is ^{and the committee} attach^d, are of opinion that it should be granted, They therefore recommend to the Gov^r & Commander in Chief that he issue an order whereby said Company shall be disbanded and the members thereof ^{liable to perform military duty} enrolled in the local Companies within whose limits they reside —
