Tillage for Farm Crops.

Probably no farmer in the country has been more successful in his work as most farmers by voice and pen than T. B. Terry of Ohio, whose specialties have been potatoes and clover. He is also earnestly advocating intensive tillage as a means of making available elements of fertility in the soil, in unavailable form as are only the poor farmers at the present time. Mr. Terry says in The Practical Farmer: Many years I have been preaching the doctrine and practicing it. At first I was bitterly attacked by men working in the interests of fertilizer manufacturers, and by others, and really stood almost alone. Many efforts were made to stop me and tongue, both openly and underhandedly. But I knew that I was right, and opposition only made me stand more ground the more firmly. I was offered at one time a fine position for ten years, under contract, where I could make four times what I get now; but I would not have sold my position for less than five times what I get now. Farm Economy.
While farmers are the most economical of all people in some respects they are the most extravagant in others. They rarely part with money without good cause to get its equivalent in exchange, and are seldom led into extravagant purchases for personal or household use, but in the matter of laying out farm work in advance and in the purchase of seed, fertilizer and farming tools they seldom exercise caution. They are ready to spend a year in advance of delivery and even now drummers are canvassing the dealers for orders for supplies for next winter.

This is the season of the year when the farmer should make plans for the season's work and purchase everything he needs so far as possible to carry out the plans in effect. Among the first to be arranged for is the labor needed, which must in most instances be employed by the year. In very few localities is it possible to secure help by the day, as was the case a generation ago. The seed, land, garden and field, and the pairs for all farm implements should be attended to now, for it is extravagant to leave these matters until the busy season. First, however, the farmer should decide which fields will be cultivated, what crops will be grown and what disposition will be made of the products of the garden and field. The farmer should be ready for market. Arrangements should also be made for such repairs upon the farm buildings as become necessary.
