27. The unexpired portion of the sentence of the General Court Martial, in the case of Private *John F. Bickford*, 5th Maine Volunteers, promulgated in General Orders, No. 57, Headquarters, Department of the East, of July 7th, 1863, is remitted. He will be released from confinement at Fort Warren, Boston Harbor, (where he now is,) and returned to duty with his regiment.
