Feeding Stock in Winter.

From an able article in a late number of the Massachusetts Plowman. "On the winter feeding of Stock"—from the pen of Sanford Howard, Sec'y of the Board of Agriculture of Michigan, we copy the following paragraphs: "To give each animal the quantity of food it requires and no more, should be the object aimed at. The quantity, of course, depends to some extent on the weather, or the temperature in which the animals is placed. The heat of the system must be kept up to a certain degree, and the source of this heat is food. In a low temperature the heat is carried off more rapidly than in a mild one—the animal body is cooled just as any other substance would be, similarly situated. In proportion to the loss of heat, is the quantity of fuel (food) required to keep the temperature and carry on its functions. If the food supplied is sufficient to supply the vital organs with the elements of heat, the tissues of the body—the carbon of the fat and flesh—must make up the deficiency, and the animal consequently grows poor. It is important, in this connection, to keep in mind the facts that as the waste of the body goes on, the animals is rendered less able to withstand exposure—it is constantly weakened, and as its strength declines, it requires more food.
